1.1 Operation Plan of the Department of Social Development and Welfare (2005-2008), Ministry of Social Development and Human Security

Vision

To be the core organization for social development and provision of full social welfare services coverage promoted by involving sectors within society in services providing under an efficient and standard management system with the aim to achieve self-reliance among the target groups.

Mission statement

1. To provide social work and social welfare services for the disadvantaged, the poor, the destitute and persons facing social problems.
2. To develop new approaches and methods of rendering social work and social welfare services and to support the technical aspect of social development and welfare.
3. To promote, support, and coordinate networks of services providers.



Strategic points of the Department of Social Development and Welfare

To achieve the vision and mission statement of the Department of Social Development and Welfare (DSDW) with the purpose of becoming the core organization in social development and welfare provision, and promoting the involvement of all sectors, to encourage the disadvantaged, the poor, homeless people and those who facing social problems to become self-reliance, effectively well-equipped with the ability to adjust to any changes. DSDW, therefore, has set up proactive strategies, and revision of execution of work in both policy measurement and area measurement to improve the operation procedure completely. Those strategic points are:

1. Promotion of service-accessibility opportunity;
2. Promotion of social immunity;
3. Prevention, rehabilitation and development of the form of social welfare services;
4. Promotion and development of living potential;
5. Promotion of self-reliance potential for older persons and families;
6. Promotion and development of networks system of social development and welfare;
7. Development of management system and service providing.

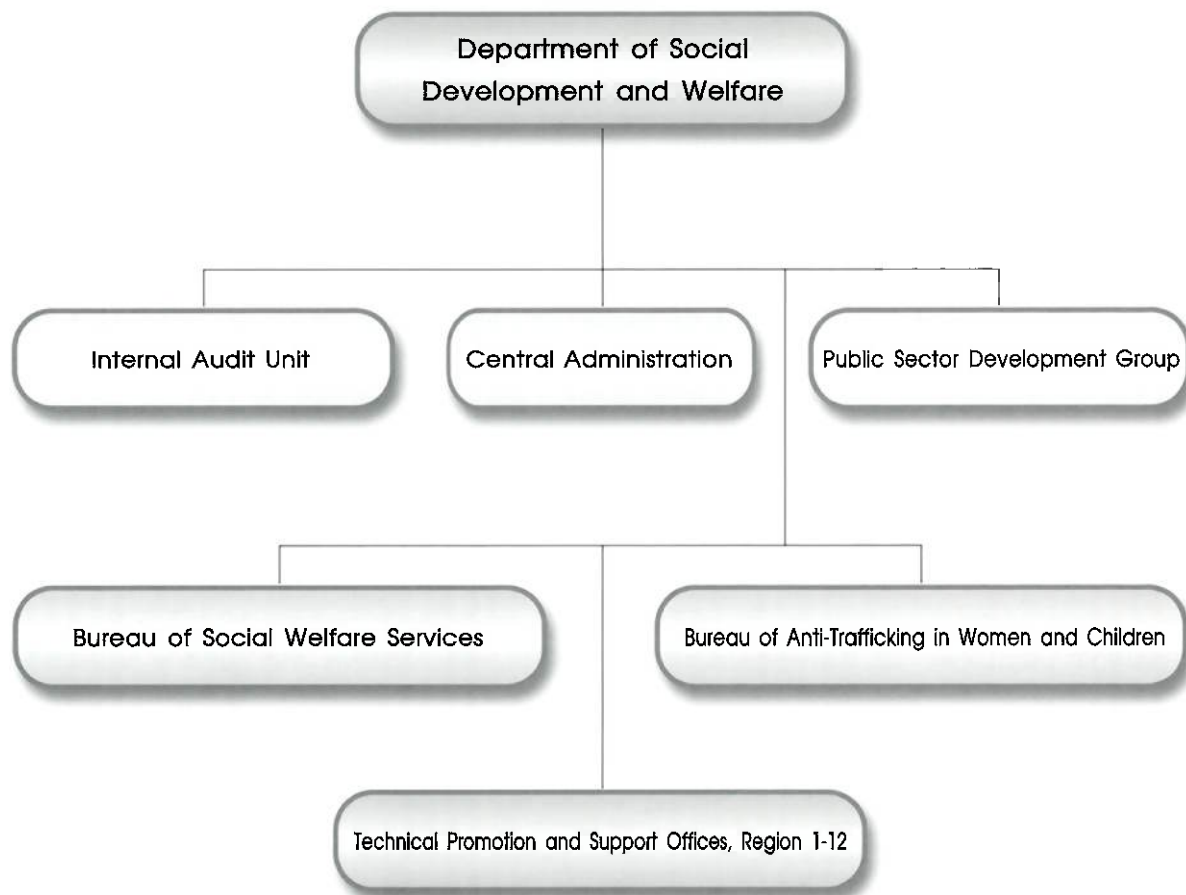

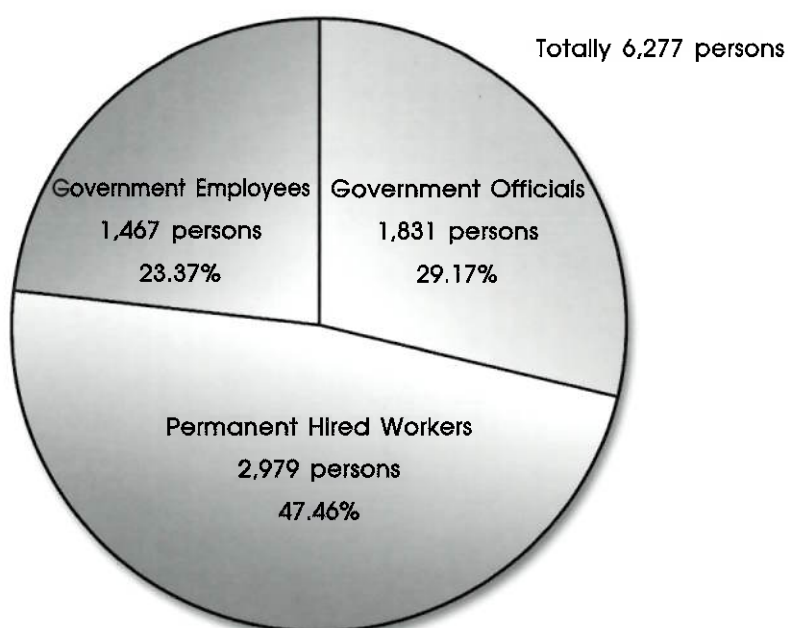

Appendices

2.1 Performance achievement in compliance with Performance Agreement in the fiscal year of 2005

Evaluation and assessment result of past performance of DSDW for the fiscal year of 2005, by the Office of Public Sector Development Commission (OPDC), is 4.6841 from the total of 5, based on following dimensions:

(1) Dimension 1: Effectiveness of missions

The performance indicators for DSDW are the success level of strategic operation; the achievement of targeted productivity; and the administration improvement to support Local Administrative Organizations. All have been achieved, except some indicators collaborating with other departments under the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security (MSDHS), which have not yet been completely achieved. However, DSDW scores 5 marks for this dimension.

(2) Dimension 2: Quality of service

To operate under the performance indicators in this dimension, DSDW has encouraged its authorities to conduct service satisfaction survey in different aspects, and used the result as a means to improve service efficiency for

people. According to the internal survey, the satisfactory result is more than 80%. Moreover, DSDW has initiated and operated several Anti-corruption and Misconduct Measurements, for example, the establishment of Official's Transparency Cooperation Office, the transparent strategic implementation of the department, the appointment of the Board of Committee to control and examine transparency, the appointment of working group to set up the specifications of Anti-Corruption and Misconduct Measurements, the set-up of ethics and morale standard for government officials, the set-up of transparency network, etc. For this measurement, DSDW scores 4.829 marks.



(3) Dimension 3: Efficiency of operation

To operate under the performance indicators in this measurement, DSDW has been budget-conscious by encouraging its subsidiaries to follow the cost-cutting and power-saving manuals. The procurement has also been done through e-Auction, which eventually saved 88,654,734 baht of the Department's budget (equivalent to 3.3%). Moreover, DSDW has also followed the Resolution of the Council of Ministries, dated May 17, 2005, concerning the Nation's Power Resolution by reducing the use of electricity and gas with the target of 10-15% comparing to those used in 2003.

As a result, DSDW could save the power by 36.79%, which entitled the Department for the First Prize of Outstanding Power-Saving Authority, in electricity category, on March 10, 2005 at the Miracle Grand Convention, Bangkok, presided by H.E. Mr. Vissanu Krea-ngam, Deputy Prime Minister. Moreover, DSDW has revised the 6-step service providing process to be 50% less complicating and less time-consuming. Accordingly, DSDW has submitted the revision plan to OPDC for evaluation. The revised 6-step process has proved to be

effective, and 4 honorable mention awards were given to DSDW for the following schemes:

1) Assistance to low-income families and those who have no one to support by the Bureau of Social Welfare Services;

2) Admission of persons with disabilities into support residence, the Bureau of Social Welfare Services;

3) Admission of children to children and family residence, Shelter for Children and Families, Bangkok;

4) Assistance to HIV-infected children, the Bureau of Social Welfare Services.

The above honorable mention awards were given to the Senior Executives of the Department of Social Development and Welfare by H.E. Mr. Vissanu Krea-ngam, on December 22, 2005 at the AMARI Watergate Hotel. The awards are taken of appreciation, pin, and motorcycle. The total score earned in this measurement is 4.264 marks.

(4) Dimension 4: Organization development

To operate under performance indicators in this dimension, DSDW has proposed "Blueprint for Change" to be used in pushing the management of operation process, service users

management, and the set-up of organization's asset management system, according to the DSDW's strategies. Moreover, DSDW has increased the efficiency of the quality of its information management and the security systems, as well as the determination to become a learning organization by following the specified schemes, which utilize the

accumulated knowledge of DSDW's personnel in 5 different perspectives, which are Social Development and Social Welfare Services; Improvement in Process and Procedure; The Support for Network of Social Development and Welfare; Information System; Human Resources Management. The total score in this dimension is 4.5176.

2.2 Performance achievement in compliance with Performance Agreement in the fiscal year of 2005

Performance achievement in compliance with Performance Agreement in the fiscal year of 2005 was in accordance with 6 out of 7 strategic points, with the 7th strategic point as the

support of the productivity and key activities, which was in line with Points 1-6. The operation was conducted as follows:

Strategic point 1: Promotion of service-assessment opportunity

Operation Pattern: To promote opportunity to access the social development and welfare services

(1.1) Project/ Key Activity:

Project on 'Assets Capitalization'

(1.2) Responsible agency:

DSDW

(1.3) Productivity V.S. Target

The productivity is the Project on 'Assets Capitalization', with the target of 30,000 persons and operation result of 30,576 persons, equivalent to 101.92%. The description is as follows:

1. Administration of the conversion of the assets into capital by examining the utilization of the land, the certificates of land utilization (No.Kho.1) for 9,346 cases, examining the utilization of the preserved land for 7,427 cases, and improvement of map and data in the certificates of 640,000 rais;

2. Occupational development and administration by providing trainings to members of self-help land settlements and people who are authorized to use the preserved lands to participate in the project for 30,576 persons.

(1.4) Result V.S. Target

16,773 members of self-help land settlements and the citizens, utilizing the land were granted the certification and were provided with the training according to the conversion of assets into capital policy. They were able to access the



sources of capital by applying for the loans. Of 4869 persons applying, 1100 persons were approved, equivalent to 22.79%. 108.18 million Baht of credits were approved from the target of 500 million Baht, equivalent to 21.64%.

(1.5) Problems and success conditions

1. Members of the settlements have had the debts with government agencies, banks, and other agencies, e.g. Agriculture Cooperatives, which disables them from making a loan according to the project.

2. The interest rates set by Bank for Agriculture and Agricultural Cooperatives (BAAC) are at 7-10%. 10% interest rate is for the new customers, and 7-9% interest rate for old customers according to customers' level are deemed higher.

3. Some of the members of the self-help land settlements did not make a loan according to the project because the need of the money was not in accordance with the conditions and purpose specified by the project.

(1.6) Suggestions

1. To ask for the lists of members of self-help land settlements who were not granted the loan and to identify the reasons of being objected by the banks. These will be used as the data to improve the qualifications of the members, as well as to improve the plan for loan request so that there will be higher possibility of other members.

2. To visit and follow-up on the members who were granted the loan by BAAC regularly in order to effectively monitor the use of the money for living, to acknowledge the problems, and provide effective solutions accordingly.

Strategic point 2: Promotion of social immunity

Operation Pattern (Focus 1): To promote social immunity/resistance among children and families

(1.1) Project/Key Activities:

1. Project on 'Children's Opportunity Promotion'

2. Project on 'Children's Improvement Caravan'

(1.2) Responsible agency:

DSDW

(1.3) Productivity V.S. Target

The productivity for this focuses are the provision of the social welfare and welfare to the disadvantaged and poor, and the project on the Children's Improvement Caravan.

Productivity 1: Provision of Social welfare and social work to the disadvantaged and poor with the target of 1,142,417 persons

The operation under this strategic focus is under the main activity of children development. The provision of services was targeted at 62,535 persons with the actual of 71,969, which was equivalent to 115.08%. The details are as follows:

1.1 Promotion of the establishment and operation of public and private homes for children, by supporting the children development kits, supplement food, and advice at 1228 homes with 69,835 children who were given proper care and development.

1.2 Promotion and development of children in the disadvantaged areas for 2,134 children of those laborers, community and construction sites. Moreover, the operation of 7 homes for children development under DSDW.



Strategic point 3: Prevention, rehabilitation and development of the form of social welfare services

Operation Pattern (Focus 1): To prevent, revive and develop the format of social welfare for targeted population

(1.1) Project/Key Activity:

Project on 'Prevention of Human Trafficking'

(1.2) Responsible agency:

DSDW

(1.3) Productivity V.S. Target

The productivity for this focuses is the provision of the social welfare and welfare to the disadvantaged and poor, with the target of 1,142,417 persons. There are two sub-activities, which are the prevention of trafficking in women and children, and prevention of prostitution, under the main activity. The target under this productivity was 50,200 persons with the actual of 54,894 persons (equivalent to 109.34%). The description is as follows:

1. The welfare to women and children who faced the problems of human trafficking by coordinating and providing assistance to 186 Thais and 510 foreigners who were victims of human trafficking. Of these figures, 836 women and children were provided assistance by institutions. (734 foreigners and 102 Thais);

2. The prevention of human trafficking by organizing activities and public relations campaigns to 54,197 people, namely students, parents, children, leaders of community.

(1.4) Result V.S. Target

The effective coordination among concerned agencies, both local and international, to provide assistance to women and children who faced the problems of human trafficking and to prevent further possible problems.



Strategic point 4: Promotion and development of living potential

Operation Pattern (Focus 1): To provide appropriate social welfare service to the targeted population

(1.1) Project/Key Activity:

Project on 'Assistance and Prevention to those face social problems'

(1.2) Responsible agency:

DSDW

(1.3) Productivity V.S. Target

The productivity for this focus can be divided into 2, which are the social welfare assistance to the disadvantaged and poor, and AIDS prevention.

Productivity 1: The social welfare assistance to the disadvantaged and poor with the target of 1,142,417 people

The operation under this productivity were divided into 2 main activities which were: the social welfare service to children, older persons, disabled, destitute, women and those facing social problems; and the improvement in service system and standard. The target was 674,788 people, with the actual of 853,863 (equivalent to 126.53%) were as follows:

Activity 1: The social welfare service to children, older persons, disabled, destitute, women and those facing social problems, with following details:

1. The social welfare service to children

1.1 To provide service in local homes for babies, reception home for children, home for children and families to 14,573 persons from the target of 10,920, equivalent to 133.45%. The categories are as follows:

1.1.1 Assistance regarding necessities and proper development to 6,102 unfortunate children, from new-born to 18 years old, in 21 homes for babies;

1.1.2 Rehabilitation service, development and welfare protection to 1,880 destitute, homeless, abused (both mentally and physically) and those with inappropriate pre-mature activities in 4 reception homes for children and children welfare protection homes

1.1.3 Welfare protection service by arranging the temporary shelters and physical and mental rehabilitation for 6,591 children and families facing social problems in 24 shelters for children and families

1.2 To provide service for families and communities, with the target of 178,111 persons and actual of 154,800 persons, equivalent to 115.05, categorized as follows:



1.2.1 Welfare to 140,036 children in poor families

1.2.2 Substitute families for 7,741 children to ensure proper love and care under the following format

- Foster families for 4,275 children
- Patronage families for 3,059 children
- Support families for 407 children

1.2.3 Children's welfare protection by giving behavior guidance to 15,538 children and parents or those seeking for advice, as well as the monitor on children's behavior, to prevent and decrease the problems of children being treated badly and illegally

1.2.4 Mobile welfare and assistance services for 14,796 persons from families

2. Social welfare and services in the form of mental and physical rehabilitation and occupational trainings to 2,051 (from

the target of 2,050, equivalent to 100.04%) disadvantaged women in 4 welfare protection and occupational development centers for women, according to Prevention and Suppression of Prostitute Act B.E. 2539 (1990).

3. Social Work and welfare service to persons with disabilities

3.1 To provide service to 24,058 persons in homes for persons with disabilities, and families in communities from the target of 23,032 persons, equivalent to 104.45%, categorized as follows:

3.1.1 Social welfare and services to 3,849 persons with disabilities in 9 homes for persons with disabilities, as well as the mobile public relations service on homes and vocational rehabilitation centers for persons with disabilities

3.1.2 Physical equipments supplies to 2,631 disabled persons

3.1.3 Social welfare and rehabilitation services to 17,292 disabled persons in families and communities, from the target of 15,000 persons, equivalent to 115.28%

4. Social work and welfare services to destitute

4.1 To provide services to 10,605 persons in homes for the destitute, from the target of 5,850 persons, equivalent to 181.28%, categorized as follows:

4.1.1 Standard and rehabilitation services, as well as occupational training to 7,801 destitute, beggars and homeless in homes for destitute, to ensure self-reliance among them

4.1.2 Assistance from public sources in Bangkok, e.g. temporary shelter, vocation, sending back to hometown services to 2,804 destitute and beggars

5. Social work and welfare services to those facing social problems by sending 36,762 hopeless persons back to their hometowns, from the target of 34,000 persons, equivalent to 108.12%

6. Social work and welfare services to low incomes families

6.1 To provide assistance to 587,703 persons with low incomes, from the target of 444,163, equivalent to 132.31%, categorized as follows:

6.1.1 Assistance to 277,059 persons with low incomes to reduce the immediate economic problems;

6.1.2 Temporary shelters in the form of travelers' shelters and shelters for persons with problems for 20,956 students and people

6.1.3 Resource arrangement for 289,688 persons facing problems

2.4 Study of pattern and structure of welfare development centers for older persons

DSDW has transferred the social welfare services for older persons to Local Administrative Organizations and Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA). However, DSDW is still responsible in settling the service administration standard and acting as mentor regarding technical knowledge.

The study of pattern and structure of 12 welfare development centers for older persons was conducted with the following results:

1. Data center
2. Training center
3. Learning center
4. Social welfare services for older persons under institution care center
5. Social welfare services for older persons within communities center
6. Counseling center

The Office of the Civil Service Commission (OCSC) has approved the changes of the names of 8 Homes for Older Persons and Social Service Centers for Older Persons, which were not transferred to Local Administrative Organizations and BMA, to Social Welfare Development Center for Older Persons, as well as the 4 newly establishment to Social Welfare Development Centers for Older Persons of Nakhon Phanom, Lampang, Pathum Thani and Songkhla.

Productivity 2: HIV/AIDS prevention

The productivity of this campaign is to prevent HIV/AIDS problem, with the target of 15,100 persons. The main activity is social welfare provision services related to HIV/AIDS problem with regards to the strategic focus, and the promotion and

improvement of living potential. The target was 15,100 persons, with the actual of 23,027 persons, equivalent to 152.49%. The description is as follows:

1. Assistance to 434 HIV/AIDS-infected children or those who indirectly affected by HIV/AIDS problems in 4 homes for children, to ensure them of their basic rights and proper development;
2. Assistance to 1,615 HIV/AIDS-infected children or those whose father, mother or parent died of AIDS, to ensure that they could maintain their proper living condition with families and communities, without having to be sent to the homes for children;
3. Financial assistance for living to 1,669 HIV/AIDS-infected women;
4. Assistance to 19,309 HIV/AIDS-infected persons and the families who were affected, to reduce their problems



and ensure that they can maintain living condition with families and communities

(1.4) Result V.S. Target

Proper assistance and welfare service accessibility were provided to the disadvantaged, poor and those affected by AIDS according to the set standard.

(1.5) Problems and success conditions

1) The operation under the strategic focus of the promotion and development of living potential shows the quantitative results under the provided budget. This is due to the amount of the disadvantaged and the poor which were higher than the budget provided, resulted in the decrease in the operation cost per head. This, therefore, made possible to only reduce immediate problems, not the permanent / long term ones.

2) Those who seek assistance from the residential homes, especially the destitute, those with mental problems and multiple disabilities require care, rehabilitation and development assistance by the specialized practitioners with special services. Therefore, the promotion and development in specialized practitioners, systems, technology and transfer must be encouraged.

Operation Pattern (Focus 2): To promote knowledge and occupational development to targeted citizens

(2.1) Project/Key Activity:

Project on 'Knowledge Promotion and Occupational Development'

(2.2) Responsible agency:

DSDW

(2.3) Productivity V.S. Target

There are two productivities under this focus, which are the social welfare and services to the targeted disadvantaged and poor, and the promotion for the local communities to welfare and social development

Productivity 1: The social welfare and services to the disadvantaged and the poor with the total productivity of 1,142,417 persons

The operation under this focus was divided into two main activities, which were the provision of social welfare and services to persons with disabilities, and the provision of social welfare and services to the disadvantaged women. The target was 30,500 persons, with the actual of 35,982 persons, equivalent to 117.97%. The description is as follows:

Activity 1: The provision of social welfare and services to persons with disabilities

1.1 The provision of social welfare and services to 1,236 persons with disabilities in 8 vocational development centers, from the target of 1,000 persons, equivalent to 123.6%, by providing vocational development to ensure the living potential, income and self-reliance. There were 11 different courses for the disables and 16 short-term courses for the disables in community.

Activity 2: The provision of social welfare and services to the disadvantaged women

2.1 Service provision for 10,781 persons in 8 welfare and vocational training centers for women from the target of 5,000 persons, equivalent to 215.62%, by providing vocational and quality of life trainings to those who lacked the chances to study, and the unemployed to ensure their better quality of life.



2.2 Vocational and unity skills for the 24,239 disadvantaged women according to the 'New Life of Women in Rural Area' from the target of 24,500, equivalent to 98.93%, which could be categorized as follows:

2.2.1 To provide vocational training to women from the risky groups, and those who lacked the chances to study according to the project, to ensure their chance to improve their lives. During the training, wages and welfare money were made available to 14,992 women, and 7,372 women in the unity skills training group were given wages.

2.2.2 To encourage the local vocational unity among 1,875 women who passed the training provided by DSDW

Productivity 2: The promotion of welfare and social development in community with the target of 772,400 persons.

The operation under this focus was divided into 2 sub-activities, which were the project on the promotion of the vocational development for sufficient economy, and H.M. Royal Initiative Projects to promote and improve quality of life. The target was 3,200 persons, with the actual of 3,770 persons, equivalent to 117.81%. The description is as follows:

2.1 The amount of 3,770 persons from 107 badges were provided with the training to promote the vocational development for sufficient economy, and the provision of the materials needed for vocational training

2.2 Members from 8 villages in the co-op Royal Initiative Project in San Kamphaeng, Chiang Mai, and from 11 villages in Huai Sat Yai co-op Royal Initiative Project in Prachuap Khiri Khan and Petchaburi, were provided with improvement of quality of life.

(2.4) Productivity V.S. Target

Disadvantaged women, persons with disabilities and targeted citizens were provided and supported with the vocational skills. More income was available for self and families according to the sufficient economy. Migrants for jobs was less possible



Operation Pattern (Focus 3): To develop potential of citizens, using the community development mechanism

(3.1) Project/Key Activity:

Project on 'Promotion and Development in Living Potential for the target'

(3.2) Responsible agency:

DSDW

(3.3) Productivity V.S. Target

The productivity under this focus was the promotion and the support for social welfare and development to community and local, with the total productivity of 772,400 persons.

The operation under this focus was divided into 2 main activities, which were social development in highland communities, and social development in specific areas. The target was 769,200 persons with the actual of 788,638,



equivalent to 102.52%. The description is as follows:

Activity 1: The social development in highland communities

1.1 The provision of social welfare and services in highland communities to 525,893 persons with the target of to 522,904 persons, equivalent to 100.57%, as following categorized:

1.1.1 The planning for village development for 220,500 persons in 375 villages

1.1.2 The development of basic utilities, e.g. improvement in land communication, repair of subordinate path and the construction of water source for 190,000 persons

1.1.3 The promotion of social development knowledge and area-appropriate occupation for 1,200 persons

1.1.4 The occupational and income development by promoting the preserved agriculture and local handicraft for OTOP commodities for 100,568 persons

1.1.5 The education promotion to 3,240 children in highland communities, by establishing 77 centers for children development, and 29 temporary schools

1.1.6 The integration of security by assisting those with urgent problems, building understanding, unity and



awareness of being Thais, to ensure the peaceful society, as well as by coordinating for cooperation to prevent the use of religion and drug as tools to damage the peace. These benefited 2,680 persons.

1.2 The promotion of community economy in highland communities to the target for knowledge and standard service provision. There were 5 courses which are workshop on business administration, workshop on alternative career promotion in highland communities, workshop on the alternatives in local product development, workshop on the product conversion, and workshop on the knowledge process in economic operation assessment in highland communities. These benefited 2,570 persons.

1.3 Royal Initiative Projects which provided the training on social welfare and

development, agricultural and non-agricultural knowledge, as well as the social welfare services and the welfare to assist those with social problems to the people in highland communities. These reduced the areas for narcotics plantation, which in turn encouraged the preserved plantation, forestry, preservation of water and soil, and the establishment of the non-agricultural career development groups, i.e. hill tribe's embroidery group, souvenir group, product conversion group. These helped increase the income, and prevent the migrants for jobs, benefited 4,835 persons.

1.4 Buddhist Mission Project which provided support to 300 Buddhist monks in 150 ashrams in the North and the West to perform religious activities in underdeveloped areas. 100,000 people in highland communities were approached with moral, education, health, economic supports and the involvement in Buddhism.

Moreover, there were trainings for community representatives, which mostly were leaders, to become volunteers of the monks in any activities, related to the spread of the words of the Buddha. Also, they served as the network for DSDW in service provision to the community.



Activity 2: Social development in specific areas

2.1 The social development in specific areas for 262,745, with the target of 246,296 persons, equivalent to 106.67%, categorized as follows:

2.1.1 Land administration by recruiting members of the self-help land settlements, and to measure lands of the 'Solving Poverty' project for 30,310 persons.

2.1.2 Social development in self-help land settlements, by recommending works related to social development and trainings, promoting the establishment and development of people organizations, promoting the preservation of culture and tradition, developing basic utilities as well as, promoting the coordination of communities for development, for 169,251 persons.

2.1.3 Occupational promotion, by conducting Royal Initiative Projects, Golden Jubilee Village Pond Project, Mixed Agriculture Project, One Tambon One Product (OTOP), as well as the promotion of non-agricultural occupational development, which enabled the members of self-help land settlements to increase their incomes and be self-reliant for 39,336 persons.

2.1.4 Water resource development in self-help land settlement by building/

repairing irrigation system and building/ repairing water supply system for the use of the members for 23,848 persons.

(3.4) Productivity V.S. Target

People in highland communities and self-help land settlements were able to earn their living as well as to get the basic utilities to better improve the potential of living for themselves, families, communities, and near-by citizens.



Strategic point 5: Promotion of self-reliance potential for older persons and families

Operation Pattern (Focus 1): To promote self-reliance potential for older persons, families and communities

(1.1) Project/Key Activity:

Project on 'Promotion of Coordination of Families and Communities to Improve the Potential of Living'

(1.2) Responsible agency:

DSDW

(1.3) Productivity V.S. Target

The productivity under this focus was the provision of social welfare and services to the disadvantaged and the poor, with the total productivity of 1,142,417 persons.

The operation under this focus was in the form of sub-activity which was the provision of social welfare and services to the older persons, under the main activity of provision of social welfare and services to children, older persons, persons with disabilities, destitute, women and those facing social problems, which



connected to the strategic focus of the Promotion of self-reliance potential for older persons and families. The target under this productivity was 325,004 persons with the actual of 355,399 persons, equivalent to 109.35%. The description is as follows:

1. To provide welfare to 1,454 older persons facing social problems, and to protect their basic rights, in 7 welfare homes;

2. To provide medical, social welfare, physical therapy, leisure as well as temporary shelter to 166,832 older persons facing social problems.

(1.4) Result V.S. Target

The older persons facing problems and those require government services were given protection of their basic rights, services and social welfare.

(1.5) Problems and success conditions

The integration of private, public and local sectors can promote better health, both mentally and physically, to older persons. It can also assure the efficient living condition for older persons, which eventually will enable them to use their wisdom to benefit the community.

Strategic point 6: Promotion and development of networks system of social development and welfare

Operation Pattern (Focus 1): To promote and improve networks of social development and welfare

(1.1) Project/Key Activity:

Project on 'Promotion and improvement of networks of Social Development and Welfare'

(1.2) Responsible agency:

DSDW

(1.3) Productivity V.S. Target

The productivity under this focus was the promotion and improvement of networks of Social Development and Welfare in communities and local areas, with the target of 772,400 persons.

The operation under this focus was in the form of main activity which was the promotion and improvement of networks of social development and welfare, with the target under 480 networks. The result of the operation was the improvement in potential of the networks of social welfare and development (Tambon level), and the promotion of the planning in 513 networks (equivalent to 106.87%), by using community stage, database, service information, public relations and follow-up.

(1.4) Result V.S. Target

Networks for social development and welfare (Tambon level) were introduced, which contributed to the development of the plan in the local level.

4.1 Past performance to H.M. King's Initiative Projects

4.1.1 Crop Project

1) Terrace Paddy Field Project

His Majesty the King visited Sukhirin Self-help Land Settlement in Narathiwat in 1976, and Si Sakhon Self-help Land Settlement in 1983, and encouraged the members to grow rice in terrace paddy field so that they would have their own rice to consume, which resulted in the decrease in household's expenses. Accordingly, Sukhirin Self-help Land Settlement supported 111 members to grow rice in terrace paddy field, field crop and vegetable for the area of 550 rais (2.5 rais is equivalent to 1 acre, and Si Sakhon Self-help Land Settlement supported 40 members to grow rice in terrace paddy field for the area of 150 rais. Eventually, members achieved the crop productivity between 30 and 50 buckets (1 bucket equivalent to approximately 15 kilograms) per rai for the year of 2005.

2) Rice Mill Project

His Majesty the King conferred rice mill machines with the aim to enable the members to grow rice and bring the produce to the rice mill so that they would have low-price rice to consume. The project operated at Prachuap Khiri



Khan Self-help Land Settlement. As a result, the members were able to sponsor 50 for 600 rais.

4.1.2 Sericulture Project

In 1977, His Majesty the King granted 1,020-rai land, which had been offered to H.M. the King by Phrom Suwan Thai Silk Co., Ltd., to the Department of Public Welfare to establish the Self-help Land Settlement under His Royal Assistance in Kap Choeng District, Surin Province. Ten rais of land were given to each family to grow mulberry and sericulture. In 2005, members had 42 rais of silk, and 280 rais of mulberry.

4.1.3 Fishery Project

In 1984, His Majesty the King visited members of Kalong Village, Si Sakhon Self-help Land Settlement in Narathiwat Province. H.M. the King royally

commanded that the waterway or canal areas be used for fishery for the purpose of both household consumption and the increase in family's income. The Self-help Land Settlements coordinated with Narathiwat Fishery Office to render fishery bleeds to members.

4.1.4 Pre-school Childhood Welfare and Development Center Projects

His Majesty the King initiated the pre-school nursery so as to promote healthiness in children and also enable parents to work for their living. Four, four and five projects were operated at Sukhirin Self-help Land Settlement, Si Sakhon Self-help Land Settlement and Than To Self-help Land Settlement respectively.

4.1.5 San Kamphaeng Village Cooperative Project in Chiang Mai Province

This was one of H.M. the King's Royal Initiatives with the purpose to help poor people in the northern part of the country, who did slash-and burn agriculture and had no proper residence, to live together and have the right to own certain piece of land for living and doing agriculture in the form of agricultural cooperative in Mae On Sub-district, Chiang Mai Province, under the supervision of San Kamphaeng agricultural village cooperative's Committee, Chiang Mai Province. The achievement for year 2005 are as follows:

1) Database survey on the master plan/resources layout in 8 villages, as well as public post inset of village, and signboard of "No Intrusion or Sale of the Land in the Project";

2) Training on "Strength and Career Development: To Improve Quality of Life", for 18 batches;



3) Training on Career Leadership for 6 batches;

4) Training on Promotion and Occupational Development (Natural agriculture path) at Center of Sustainable Learning, Pa Ngio Sub-district, Wiang Pa Pao District, Chiang Rai Province, so that members would learn sustainable development and adapt the knowledge for agriculture for 8 batches, total of 240 persons;

5) Training on "Readiness on Community and Self's Problem Solving Solution" for 8 batches, total of 240 persons;

6) Training on Promotion and Occupational Development for knowledge, business conduct and career for occupation stability, for 8 batches, total of 240 persons;

7) Training on Saving for Community Welfare, for 8 batches, total of 240 persons;

8) Workshop on 5-year Master Plan on Social Development and Welfare (2006-2011) for 40 persons;

9) Three Meetings of the Project Committee, and 6 meetings of working groups of Cooperative Development and Career Development;

10) Six Publications of Journals and Newsletters annually at 900

volumes each, for the total of 5,400 volumes;

11) Quality of Life developments for persons facing social problems, e.g. welfare money for children in 40 families, welfare for 11 groups of low-income workers, and 7 wheelchairs for persons with disabilities;

12) Promotion of Early Childhood Development Center, e.g. learning-teaching, materials, and stationery.

4.1.6 Huai Sat Yai, Hup Kaphong, Don Khun Huai, Nong Phlap Klat Luang Village Cooperatives Project, Prachuap Khiri Khan and Phetchaburi Provinces

These projects were His Majesty the King's Wishes with the purpose to unite those with slash-and-burn agriculture to live together, and granted land for living and agricultural purpose under Agricultural Cooperative, operated by the Committee. In 2005, the achievements were as follows:

1) Set-up of Community Strength Training Projects:

- Social Development and Welfare Network for community strength Projects in Don Khun Huai Sub-district, Cha-am District and Khao Krapuk Sub-district, Tha Yang District, Phetchaburi Province, and Huai Sat Yai Sub-district,

Hua Hin District, Prachuap Khiri Khan Province. The numbers of trainees were 600;

- Workshops on Social Development and Welfare plan in Don Khun Huai Sub-district, Cha-am District, Phetchaburi Province, and Nong Phlap Sub-district, Huai Sat Yai Sub-district, Hua Hin District, Prachuap Khiri Khan Province. There were 180 trainees;

- Children and Youth Strength Project in Huai Sat Yai agricultural cooperative. There were 300 trainees.

2) Set-up of Career Development Strength for occupational groups:

- Center of His Majesty the King's Wish for Land Development in Nong Phlap Sub-district, Hua Hin District, Prachuap Khiri Khan Province, attended by 60 trainees;

- Huai Sat Yai Center of Productivity, Huai Sat Yai Sub-district, Hua Hin District, Prachuap Khiri Khan Province, attended by 60 trainees;

- Khao Krapuk Sub-district, Tha Yang District, Phetchaburi Province, attended by 120 trainees.

3) Public Relations for the Projects, using a set of video and book.

4) Development Project and Campaign on the use of reed according to His Majesty's Initiatives for 3 areas in Nong Phlap Sub-district, Hua Hin District, Prachuap Khiri Khan Province

5) Organization of a meeting of the working group at Cha-am, Phetchaburi Province.

4.1.7 Development Project and Campaign on the use of reed according to His Majesty's Initiatives

This project's aim was to encourage the poor in the area of career promotion and development for sufficient economy and authorities under DSDW to grow reed according to His Majesty's initiative (2003-2006). This was to encourage citizens and authorities to effectively manage the land and production factors to prevent land surface loss, and to maintain the prosperity in



agriculture so that there would be enough productivity for consumption and extra earnings all year round. This also promoted self-reliance and security among families and community, as well as enabling the authorities to balance the ecology system. In 2005, the growth of reed around the ponds, mixed patches of farmers, who were the members of the project and authorities under DSDW, were promoted for 102 spots with 2,000,000 seedlings for the budget of 3,330,000 Baht, together with the arrangement of MOU of 11 authorities to operate the Reed Project to extol the King (2005-2007) as invited by the Ministry of Agriculture and Cooperatives. Reports were done and proposed to Ministry of Social Development and Human Security, Ministry of Agriculture and Cooperatives, and Office of the Royal Development Projects Board (RDPB) to further present to His Majesty the King.

Besides, DSDW set up the budget to support 4 projects under His Majesty's Royal Initiatives, which were Highland Agricultural Development (Royal Projects), Extension Projects for sustainable agricultural development, Thai hill tribe Citizens Development in Mae Hong Son Province, and the Preservation Project of Forest and Wild Animals

Resources in 5 junction eastern provinces. The purposes were to secure people's career, income and quality of living, to revive and preserve natural resources and environment, as well as the richness of water source, and to set up legally permanent home base along the Thai-Burmese border.

The target population was in the highland of 5 provinces, i.e. Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Mae Hong Son, Nan and Kamphaeng Phet, and another 5 eastern provinces, i.e. Chanthaburi, Chon Buri, Rayong, Sa Kaeo and Chachoengsao. For fiscal year 2005, DSDW received the budget of 8,948,648 Baht for the operation of His Majesty's Initiatives projects regarding the basic utilities development, several trainings for hill tribes, agricultural support, as well as the welfare to assist the poor in the target areas. There were 4,835 beneficiaries.

1. Social Welfare and Development Training regarding Agriculture and Non-agriculture for 1,035 persons.

2. Agricultural Promotion in 1,811 rais, with 2,460 beneficiaries.

3. Family Welfare services to hill tribes for 1,140 persons.

4. Family Welfare services to 200 low-income persons and destitute in the eastern area.

4.2 Missions assigned by the Government

4.2.1 Assistance to earthquake and Tsunami victims

DSDW was assigned by the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security to provide assistance to those affected from earthquake and Tsunami in 6 provinces, i.e. Phuket, Phang-nga, Krabi, Ranong, Trang and Satun, and to establish the co-operation centers to assist the victims in Phang-nga and Ranong, which provided the following assistance:

1. Dispatch of the teams of social workers, psychologists, development officers, and nursing staff to visit the families and provide advice, rehabilitation, and other assistance as deemed appropriate for the victims;

2. Provision of welfare money to the victims to alleviate the basic torment;

3. Transfer of the victims from the six provinces and Republic of Maldives to their hometown by providing guidance and carrier assistance, food, as well as to follow-up on the assistance;

4. Establishment of Early Childhood Development centers in both temporary and permanent residences, i.e. 8 centers in Takua Pa District, 1 center in Thai Mueang District, Phang-nga Province, 1 center in Phuket and 1 center in Krabi;

5. Establishment of Children and Families Residence in Thung Wa Village, Khuek Khak Sub-district, Takua Pa District, Phang-nga Province;



6. Establishment of Citizen Association Stage to support the needs and necessity, as well as, the appointment of the community's representative to serve as a network in coordinating with other authorities to solve the problems;

7. Short-term and long-term occupational trainings for the victims in Krabi, Phang-nga, and Ranong Provinces, with 3,989 attendees in 19 vocational courses. The products generated 3,451,298 Baht, resulted in income 230-280 Baht per person per day;

8. Promotion of Coalition of 76 groups of Vocational trainees from the three provinces, i.e. Krabi, Phang-nga, and Ranong, for the total of 1,474 persons;

9. Co-ordination with foreign agencies such as:

- Orchidee Families Association (Foster families), France, with

scholarships to children and assistance to pre-school children for 30 children at 6,500 Baht per person per year until their graduation according to their potential. The total amount was 195,000 Baht;

- Familjeförbunden för internationell adoption (FFIA), a foster children organization from Sweden with the amount of 768,700 Baht. The project was currently being considered;

- Adoption Advocates International (AAI), a foster children organization in U.S.A., with USD 2,525 (equivalent to 101,040 Baht). The project was being considered;

- Misseri Cordi Foundation, Italy, expressed their willingness to establish children development center in Mueang District, Phuket Province;

- Ajinomoto Foundation donated money to establish Child



Development Center at Hat Praphat Village, Mu 2, Kaphuan Sub-district, Suk Samran District, Ranong Province;

- Thai Community in Sydney, New South Wales, Australia, donated money via the Royal Thai Consulate-General, Sydney for the amount of AUD 45,000 (equivalent to 1,350,000 Baht) to establish Child Development Center in Phang-nga Province;

- The Muslim Women's Group Berlin: MWG), a group of ambassadors' wives in Berlin, Germany donated Euro 7,000 (equivalent to 351,205 Baht) to support the operation of Children Center which was being

constructed in the area of Tsunami victims' permanent residences in Phang-nga Province.

10. Measurement on loss children and abduction of the young victims

- Cooperate with the Immigration Bureau to check carefully. In the case of adoption of children to live abroad, the name must appear in the name lists in the permission letter, sending directly to Immigration Bureau only;

- Cooperate among the subsidiary agencies to provide affected children with systematic and effective assistance.



4.2.2 Assistance for people affected from the unrest in southern border provinces

DSDW provided assistance to those affected from the unrest according to the Cabinet Resolution dated May 31, 2005, to facilitate the affected persons with mental rehabilitation, decrease the stress and anxiety in living condition, and to enable self-reliance, as well as, to strengthen the peace among families and community. The operations were as follows:

1. Career Promotion and Development for Sufficiency Economy, operating in 2 areas, i.e. Mu 6, Khlong Klang Village, Khuan Nori Sub-district, Khok Pho District, Pattani Province, and Mu 2, Khuan Ple Village, Tha Ruea Sub-district, Khok Pho District, Pattani Province, with the 60 attendees for the amount of 83,060 Baht;

2. Provide cash welfare assistance to low-income persons and destitute for immediate relief of 3,735 persons of those facing social problems for the amount of 5,513,500 Baht;

3. Provision of tricycles/ wheelchairs for 32 persons with disabilities in the total value of 120,000 Baht;

4. Welfare and Rehabilitation for 250 persons with disabilities, for the amount of 420,000 Baht;

5. Welfare for 34 Thai citizens to return back to their hometown, for the amount of 25,000 Baht;

6. Welfare for 25 HIV/AIDS-infected persons, patients and families, for the amount of 56,000 Baht;

7. Trainings against trafficking for 1,800 young women in educational institutes, for the amount of 144,000 Baht;

8. Welfare money to make a living for 2 persons affected by HIV/AIDS, for the amount of 10,000 Baht;

9. Welfare for the establishment of children care and development center for 2,077 children, for the amount of 166,200 Baht;

10. Welfare for 135 older persons in Thaksin Social Service Center for Older Persons, Yala Province, for the amount of 2,722,980 Baht

11. Social Development in 6 specific areas, i.e. Than To Self-help Land Settlement, Southern Self-help Land Settlement, Betong Self-help Land Settlement, Si Sakhon Self-help Land Settlement, Sukhirin Self-help Land Settlement and Khok Pho Self-help Land Settlement, for 24,984 persons, for the total amount of 21,040,161 Baht.

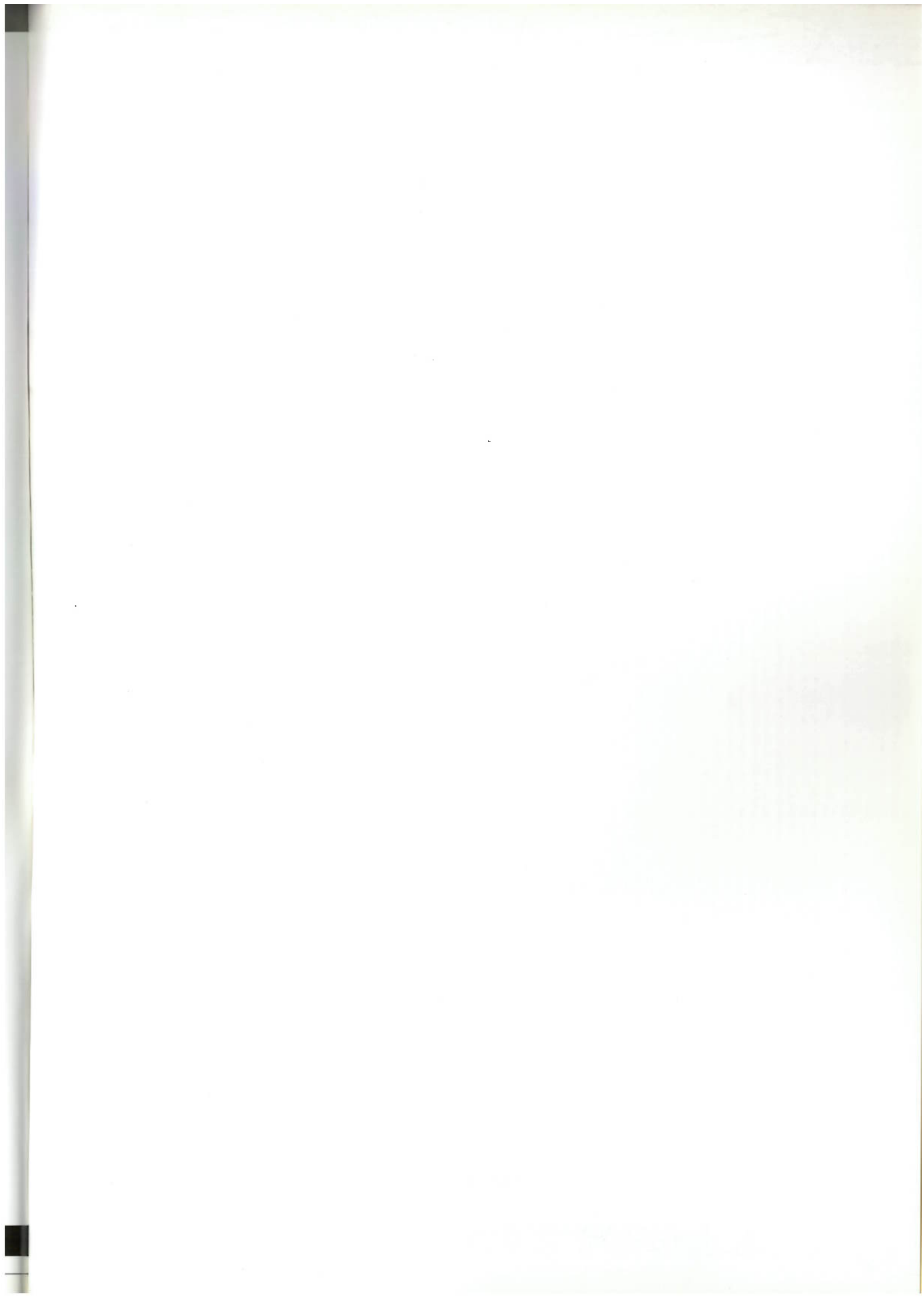
