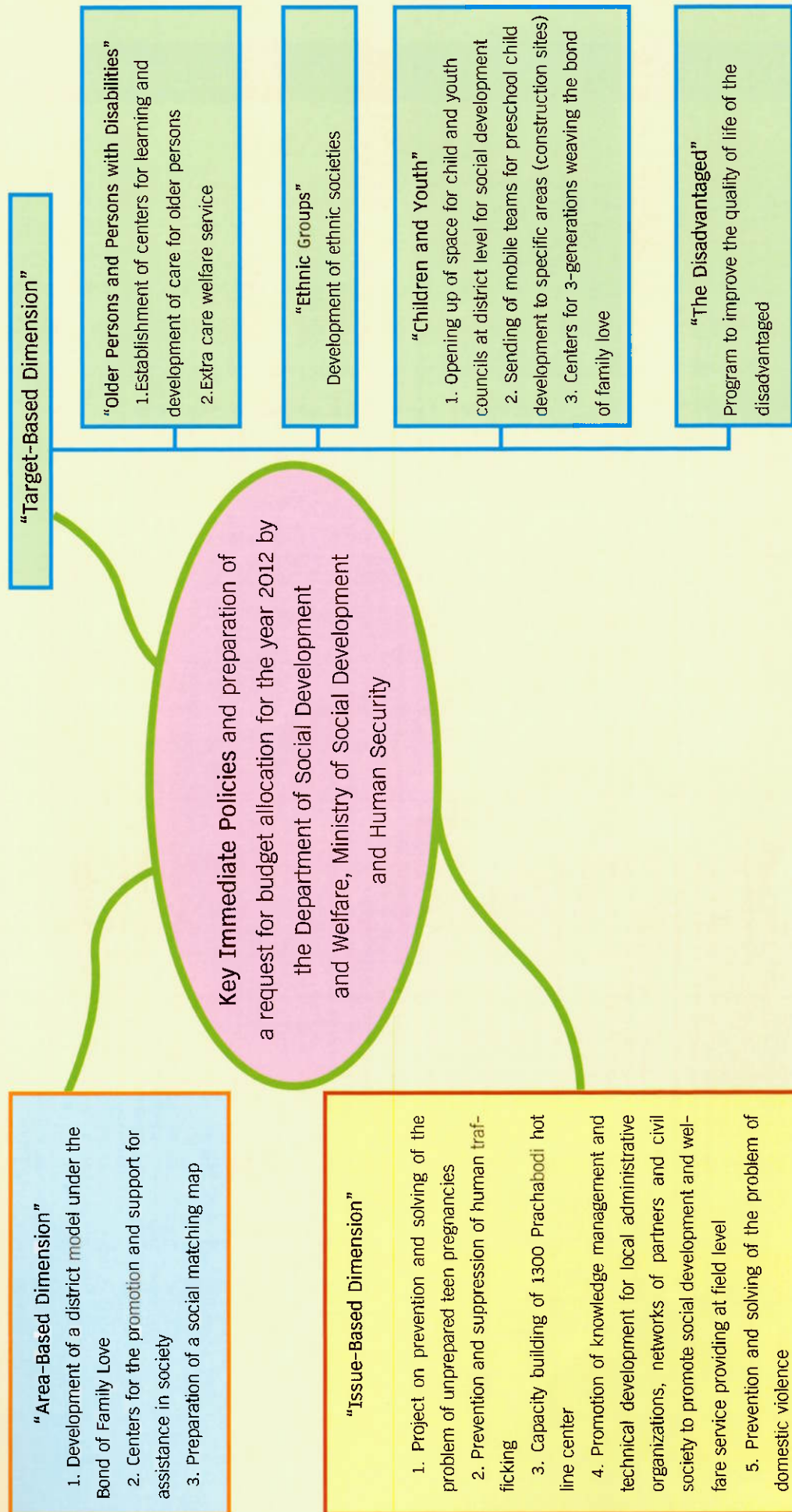

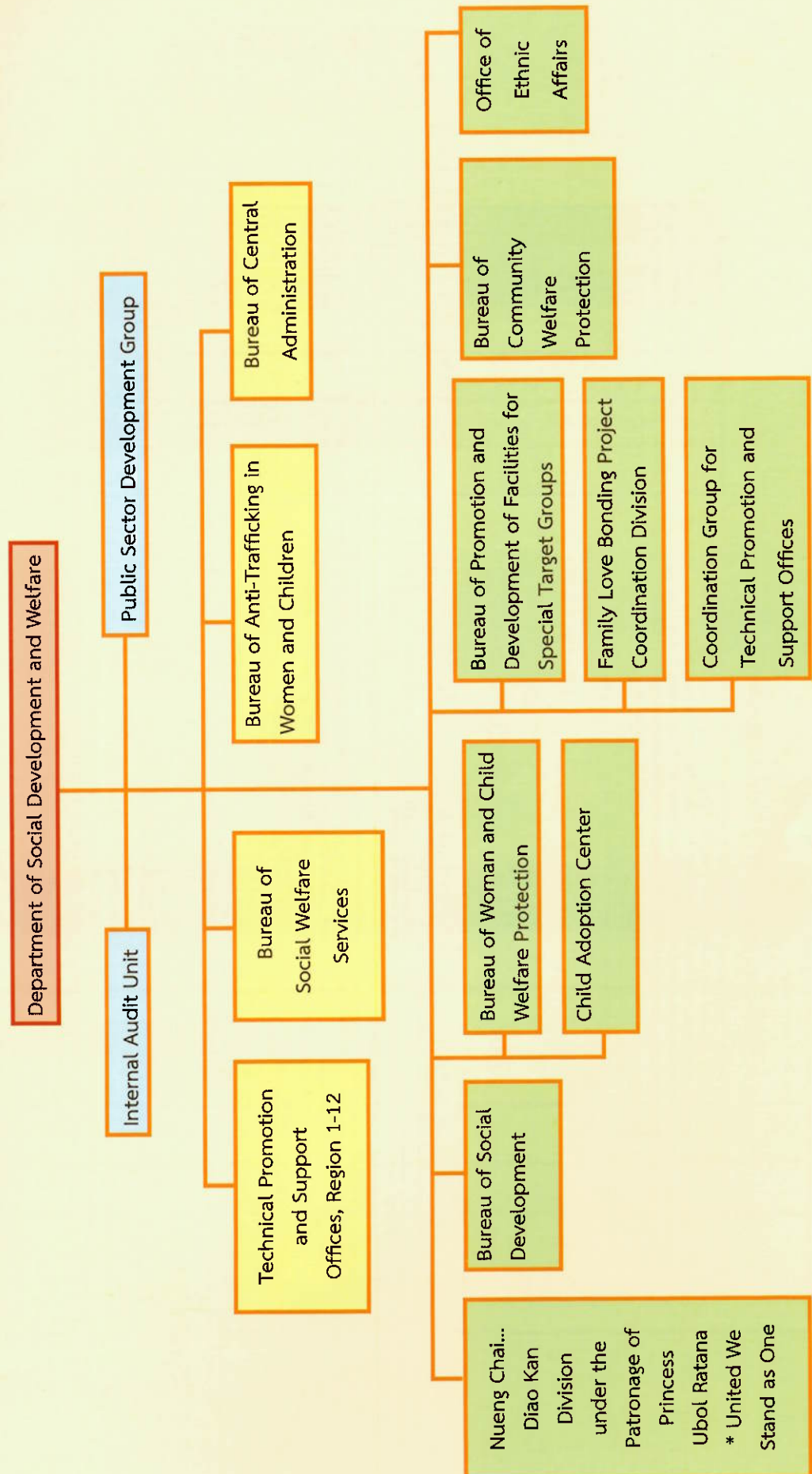

Part II

Performance Outcome in Fiscal Year 2012

Out of the 4 strategic issues, the Department of Social Development and Welfare performed duties relating to the provision of social work and social welfare services for the disadvantaged, the poor, the destitute and people facing social problems under the Action Plan of the Department covering 3 strategic issues. As for the 4th strategic issue concerning the promoting of organization development to increase the capacity of the organization for management that keeps abreast of current changes, several activities were implemented including solving problems and providing assistance in the form of institutional-based or residential services, coordination and referral services to clients to other agencies concerned and promoting participation by local communities and authorities in the provision of social welfare services such that the target groups facing social problems could lead their life and become self-reliant with human dignity. The work as performed by the Department of Social development and Welfare proceeded in a way that supported main activities and outputs relating to Strategic Issues 1-4 such that the efficiency and set goal under the plan could be subsequently achieved. The results classified by strategic issues are as follows:



Strategic Issue 1: Upgrading the quality of social services to be provided up to standard, equally and thoroughly

To promote the strategic issue of upgrading the quality of social services to be provided up to standard, equally and thoroughly, the Department adopted the following 4 strategies:



Strategy 1: Increasing knowledge and suitable family environment for children and youth;

Strategy 2: Promoting and providing social welfare services for the target groups;

Strategy 3: Promoting the provision of social welfare services and making use of the capacity of older persons to benefit the society at large;

Strategy 4: Strengthening the prevention protection for persons who are affected by the problems and prone to risks.

The implementation of activities in response to strategy 1: Increasing knowledge and suitable family environment for children and youth

Output: The output was children and youth who were provided with knowledge and suitable family environment.

Output against target:

The output was children and youth who were provided with knowledge and





suitable family environment. The overall set target was 61,443 beneficiaries and the actual output was 82,276 beneficiaries or 113.91% of the set target. To achieve the output, 8 key activities were implemented of which the details are as follows:

Key Activity 1: Improving the environment within private-run child care centers for pre-school children – The aim was to promote better knowledge and skills of the private-run child care operators, child care workers, parents and guardians of children who acquired services at private-run child care/ child welfare centers. It was also the aim of this key activity to encourage private-run child care/ child welfare centers to improve the quality of their services. In 2012, there were 11,400 persons who benefitted from the implementation of this key activity as compared to the set target of 11,400 persons.

Key Activity 2: Promoting and supporting the placement of children in suitable adoptive / foster families – Focus was on orphans and abandoned children who were under institutional care provided by the Department of Social Development and Welfare and 4 child welfare organizations. They also included children who could not be properly cared for by their parents bearing in mind the optimal benefit they were entitled to enjoy according to the law. The aim was to ensure that these children would grow up in the environment of a family comprising parents and other family members and have a chance to be provided with warm love and care, education and development in all areas that was suitable for their age. The overall target was 7,925 children and the actual output was 7,626 children.

Key Activity 3: Building the capacity of children and youth under the Miracle of Life



Project – The unit within the Department that was responsible for project implementation was Nung Jai Deao Gun (United We Stand as One) Division under the Patronage of Princess Ubolratana Rajakanya Sirivahana Barnavadi. The project aimed at providing children and youth with opportunity and space where they could show their poten-



tial and interest suitable with the changing Thai society and within the limit of decent Thai culture. The project was well aware of the importance of developing the quality of life of children such that they could develop their potential and creative leadership skills which they could make use of to benefit society at large. As a result, activities relating to enhancing the potential and leadership skills under the conceptual framework of “Human capital....Giving for the society” were organized based on an academic paper about child and youth psychology. The paper which was entitled child and youth human capital was produced by Professor Suriyadev Tripathi and his team. Activities were subsequently carried out and involved children in formal and non-formal education, aged between 14-18 years old from 20 provinces of 6 regions. Compare to the set target of 12,000 children/youth, there were totally 13,830 children/youth participating in the project.

Key Activity 4: Developing a child and youth learning process – A child and youth learning process was enhanced by promoting child and youth IQ and EQ development which was done by encouraging communities to establish suitable learning and recreation centers for children and youth and giving support to activities that would enhance child development in the learning centers. Compare to the set target of 26,000 persons, there were totally 13,830



persons who gained benefit from this key activity.

Key Activity 5 : Organizing activities for children and youth facing social problems at the Por Kla Khunatham (Cultivation of moral values) Institution – Focus was on child and youth development from a morality-based dimension which ran parallel with the provision of formal education and occupational skills. An integrated approach was applied in working with Darn Makhamtia Widayakhom School in the preparation of learning and teaching materials for children and working with Thasadet Temple in the provision of knowledge for children concerning moral values and ethics.



In 2012, the Department issued a notice concerning the application and selection of children and youth who already completed education at primary level (grade 6) and lower secondary level (grade 9) nationwide to participate in the project for the school year 2012. A committee was set up in each province to be responsible for selecting qualified child and youth representatives. Accommodation was made available for these representatives who were from Bangkok and 76 provinces all through their learning period of 3-6 years.





They comprised 2 dormitories of which the construction had already been complete. One was for boys and the other was for girls. For boys, arrangements were made for them to be ordained. Those who were not yet prepared to be ordained would be encouraged to observe the 5 and 8 religious precepts. As for girls, they

were also encouraged to observe and follow the 5 and 8 religious precepts. Compare to the set target of 500 children/youth, there were totally 480 children/youth who participated in the activities.

Key Activity 6: Improving the quality of life of preschool children in disadvantaged communities – Cooperation had been maintained between NGOs working with street children and the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration in organizing camp activities and other consistent development activities with the aim to enhance life skills of street children such that they were equipped with knowledge about their rights and the ability to lead their own life based on each individual interest. Compare to the set target of 450 children, there were totally 450 children who participated in the activities.

Key Activity 7: Implementing the project on preventing and solving the problem of teen pregnancies – The project on preventing and solving the problem of teen pregnancies as implemented by the Department of Social Development and Welfare involved moving the driving force for preventing and solving the



problem of teen pregnancies. It aimed to enable children, youth, families and society at large to become aware of the problem and participate in the prevention and solving of the problem. In this connection, relevant activities were carried out continuously including running a campaign among agencies under the Department such as shelters for children and families, social development centers residential homes, welfare and occupational training centers for women. Activities also covered networks of youth and thought-provoking leaders i.e. parents, guardians and community leaders. Compare to the set target of 19,000 persons, there were totally 36,400 persons who participated in the activities.



Key Activity 8: Enhancing life skills and experience of children and youth before being integrated into mainstream society – Support was given to children under the care of the Department's residential homes to spend their time living in self-help and settlement communities to learn how to lead one's life from society outside the

homes, develop the skill of how to adjust themselves to be able to live with others and be able to become self-reliant after leaving the homes. Compare to the set target of 57 children/youth, there were totally 60 children/youth who participated in the activities.

1.3 Outcome against target:

Children and youth developed a healthy growth suitable with their age. They gained knowledge, enhanced their potential and developed physically,



mentally, socially, emotionally. They were also able to adjust themselves with surrounding environment, to live along the Thai way of life and to be well prepared to deal properly with any social changes they might have to encounter. The target population went through a learning process and developed the skills required for leading their life in society and for safeguarding themselves against any social problems and risks at the level that met the criteria that had been set.



The implementation of activities in response to strategy 2: Promoting and providing social welfare services for the target groups, there were 2 outputs:

Output 1: The target population was provided with social welfare services;

Output 2: The target population who was provided with knowledge and occupational development.

Output against target:

The output was the target population who was provided with social welfare services. The overall set target was 534,980 beneficiaries and the actual output was 1,528,908 beneficiaries or 285.79% of the set target. To achieve the output, 6





key activities were implemented of which the details are as follows:

Key Activity 1: Providing institution-based welfare services – The overall target was 17,513 beneficiaries and the actual output was 19,253 beneficiaries. The details of this key activity are as follows:

– Provision of institution-based welfare services for children and youth: Institutional-based welfare services and facilities were available in such institutions as reception homes, residential homes, child welfare protection homes, vocational training centers, child development and rehabilitation centers. Services were provided in several forms i.e. welfare services in 25 residential homes, reception homes, child welfare protection homes and vocational training centers for children and youth from new born babies to 18 years old. Services available included the provision of 4 basic necessities as well as all aspects of child and youth development to prepare them for reintegration into families and society. Welfare services were also provided in 4 child development and rehabilitation centers for boys and girls from 6 – 19 years old who needed special medical treatment and rehabilitation services i.e. children with emotional/mental problems, aggressive behavior, mental health problems or those who had tendencies to commit suicide or hurting themselves. Services available included those relating to medical treatment, physical and mental rehabilitation and adjustment, education and vocational training. Compare to the set target of 7,290 children/youth, there were totally 7,217 children/youth who benefitted from the services.

– Provision of institution-based welfare services for women: Services were provided for a total of 1,338 women in 4 welfare protection and occupational development centers for women covering welfare protection



and assistance for women and children who faced the problems as identified in the Prevention and Suppression of Prostitution B. E. 2539 (1996) and other social problems to enable them to eventually become self-reliant. Compare to the set target of 1,300 women, there were totally 1,300 women who benefitted from the services.



- Provision of institution-based welfare services for the destitute: Services were provided for a total of 5,519 destitute persons in 11 reception homes and homes for the destitute which included welfare for the homeless, the destitute and beggars. Services available included provision of 4 basic necessities, physical as well as mental rehabilitation and vocational training to enable them to help themselves and to lead a normal life within society. Referral service to other concerned agencies for further assistance was also provided for this particular target group. Compare to the set target of 4,049 persons, there were totally 5,519 persons who benefitted from the services.

- Broadening of the coverage of institution-based welfare services for the destitute and psychiatric patients in preparation for the Mental Health Act B.E. 2551, welfare services for children according to the Family Court Act and the Juvenile Court Procedure B.E. 2553 which were promoted in 15 shelters for children and families. Compare to the set target of 41 persons, there were totally 132 persons who benefitted from the services.

- Provision of institution-based welfare services for persons with disabilities: Services were provided in 13 homes (11 homes for persons with disabilities and 2 half-way homes for





rehabilitating psychiatric patients) for persons with disabilities who had no one to care for or those who had been cared for improperly. Temporary accommodation was also available for person with disabilities and rehabilitating psychiatric patients who wished to obtain rehabilitation services at the homes covering the provision

of 4 basic necessities, physical rehabilitation by doctors, education, vocational training, the organizing of recreation and social activities and the preparation of their physical and mental well-being so that they could become self-reliant and eventually integrate into society as valuable members. Compare to the set target of 4,413 persons, there were totally 4,755 persons who benefitted from the services.

Key Activity 2: Providing community-based welfare services – The overall target of this key activity was 496,777 beneficiaries and the actual output was 1,486,921 beneficiaries. The details are as follows:

- Prevention and rehabilitation services for persons who had gone through drug addiction treatment and those who were in the high risk groups: Services which were provided for a total of 147 persons at Ban Pak Jai, Saraburi Province included psychological rehabilitation and adjustment, capacity building and preparation of persons undergone the drug addiction treatment such that they were well-prepared to make a decent living, earn cash income and be able to live with their families and communities.

- Welfare protection of the disadvantaged in urban communities: It was promoted by offering mobile team services to provide knowledge relating to the disadvantaged's rights and laws, welfare services to ease problems face by people who were.



in distress and referral services for those who lived in slums in the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration areas. There were totally 800 cases which requested for services.



- Provision of community-based welfare services for the target group of persons with disabilities: Services were provided for a total of 24,666 persons with disabilities by community rehabilitation centers for persons with disabilities in communities in the forms of group home and home care services.

- Provision of various welfare services for the destitute and low-income persons: A campaign to raise funds and allocate in-kind assistance to ease problems faced by persons who were in distress and offering temporary accommodation service to low-income travelers who were school or college students and people in general numbering 1,158,952 persons.

Key Activity 3: Developing the system/form and standard of services for each target group – The output of integrated social development and welfare was a participatory research on social welfare service providing for older persons at district level. A total of 36 districts were selected. They were the districts with a high proportion of older persons when compared to the population in all age groups which the number could be ranked from 1-3. The results revealed that the community-based and family-base care was found to be suitable. The services could be provided in the form of all-purposed centers for older persons or direct service targeting for older persons which were seen as being necessary and important for the provision of welfare services for older persons in the long run.

Key Activity 4: Providing social work and social welfare services relating



to HIV/AIDS – The overall target was 16,390 persons and the actual output was 17,365 persons. The details of this key activity are as follows:

- Community-based welfare services for persons infected with or affected by HIV/AIDS: Services were provided in several forms including funding support to start income-generating activities, child welfare assistance in the form of cash for children in families affected by HIV/AIDS, AIDS patients and their families. There were a total of 16,989 persons who benefitted from the services.

- Welfare assistance for HIV/AIDS infected or affected children under institutional care: There were a total of 286 children who benefitted from the services.

- Provision of knowledge for staff about HIV/AIDS: Action was taken for the prevention of HIV/AIDS by providing knowledge for 90 responsible officials of involved agencies such that they were equipped with essential knowledge on how to protect and take good care of themselves while working with the HIV/AIDS infected persons.



Key activity 5: Providing welfare protection for the disadvantaged to



ensure services they were entitled to receive according to the basic human rights – Activities covered building and developing channels to facilitate a better flow of news and information for the target groups. Such development would offer the disadvantaged, persons facing social problems and those who were in the high risk group



greater access to services that were available. A public relation campaign was held to distribute documents with detailed information given concerning their rights and sources of assistance they may sought when facing problems. Other activities that had been carried out included receiving and processing requests for assistance by persons facing social problems to ensure that

they would be provided with opportunity and their rights regarding social welfare would be fulfilled. Compare to the set target of 2,000 persons, there were a total of 2,878 persons who benefitted from the services.

Key Activity 6: Rendering welfare assistance through 1300 Prachabodi Call Center

– The center received cases which were informed by people facing social problems, the general public or network organizations from both public and private sectors. Services were provided 24 hours a day through the 1300 Prachabodi Hot Line. These included provision of services relating to useful information, advice, suggestions, information about the duties of the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security (MSDHS) and services provided by agencies under the ministry. In addition, a service team of the Department had been set up to work in collaboration with the MSDHS and the multi-disciplinary teams as well as field-level networks. Referral service was also available for cases that needed to be referred to other concerned agencies for further assistance. Compare to the set target of 2,300 persons, there were a total of 2,491 persons who requested for services.

Output 2: The target population who was provided with knowledge and occupational development.





2.3 Outcome against target:

The output was the target population who was provided with knowledge and occupational development. The overall set target was 48,740 beneficiaries and the actual output was 49,978 beneficiaries or 102.54% of the set target. To

achieve the output, 3 key activities were implemented of which the details are as follows:

Key Activity 1: Enhancing vocational skills of high-risk women and persons with disabilities in institutions – The activity, which showed the results of work concerning persons with disabilities and made a reputation for the agency concerned, involved a resident of the Department's home for mentally disabled boys (Rachavadee Home), Mr. Mongkol Jit-sa-ngiam, aged 24 years old. He participated in the 2012 Paralympic Games held in the U.K. and won a gold medal in a paralympic sport of boccia. He was a client who joined activities that concerned rehabilitation services for persons with disabilities covering physical and vocational therapy as well as capacity building for persons who were mentally disabled to the extent that he became successful in the game he played. As for Pak Kret Home for Children with Disabilities (Nonthaphoom Home), a success was made by Mrs. Supanya Khardmai, a former client of the home who participated in the 8th International Abilympics 2001 held in Seoul, Korea and won a





silver medal in crochet knitting and got a cash reward from the Department of Skill Development. Compare to the set target of 4,465 persons, there were a total of 4,603 persons who benefitted from the activities.

Services were also available at the service centers for persons with autism. Day care service was offered to persons with autism from the age of 12 years old. Alternatively, they might be admitted into the centers where respite service and other services were provided including health care, medical treatment, physical therapy, vocational and psychological rehabilitation, education, social, recreation, religious and several activities that would contribute to the ability of persons with autism in leading their life in society. Compare to the set target of 120 persons, there were a total of 124 persons who benefitted.

Key Activity 2: Organizing vocational training and developing group formation skills – A short-term (5-day) vocational training project had been drawn up and activities were carried out starting from late July 2011 to 16 January 2012 with the aim to help the victims of huge widespread flooding that happened in many parts of the country. The flooding further affected both the lives and the property of a large number of population whether seen from the economic, environment, health or livelihood points of view. The Department of Social Development and Welfare was aware of the problems that emerged and, therefore, organized a short-term (5-day) vocational training course to provide the victims of the natural disaster with income, an opportunity to make



a living and capacity building such that they could become self-reliant and be able to help themselves and their families. The project was implemented in 78 shelters of 12 provinces. Focus of the training curriculum was on the potential and interest of the vocational trainees.



Another 15-day project that had been implemented involved vocational skill and capacity development, provision of social work and social welfare services and occupational promotion and development. The project was geared towards the target group who were poor, low-income earners and those who faced problems or were in distress such that they could earn sufficient income required for maintaining their economic well-being, become self-reliant, enjoy a better quality of life and benefit from family and community empowerment.



Compare to the set target of 40,100 persons, there were totally 40,100 participants, 22 classes, with 10 participants in each class, who benefited from the project implemented in 62 provinces.

Key Activity 3: Promoting and implementing social development based on the philosophy of sufficiency economy – The Coordinating Center for the Royal Initiative Projects offered various services to members of the projects i.e. providing information about how to request for welfare



assistance, organizing activities for children and youth, providing building facility for members of various groups in communities to be used for meeting, training or group formation activities. The aim was to enable project members to increase their knowledge, to be engaged in income-generating activities and earn income along the line of sufficiency economy, to be involved in community-based management and to be able to access public services.



In 2012, the model of the Bond of Family Love Project was used by the center to guide its operations targeting towards improving the quality of life of members within the project areas, empowering families, communities and local administrative organizations and encouraging their participation in the provision of social welfare services in communities in a way that was suitable for each project area. There were totally 6,939 persons who benefitted from activities that were implemented under this key activity as compared to the set target of 4,175 persons.





The implementation of activities in response to strategy 3: Promoting the provision of social welfare services and making use of the capacity of older persons to benefit the society at large

Output: The output was the target population who were provided with social welfare services for older persons.

Output against target

The output was the target population who was provided with social welfare services. There were totally 114,497 beneficiaries or 120.11 % of the set target of 95,330 beneficiaries. The details are as follows:

Key Activity 1: Organizing activities in social welfare development centers for older persons – The social welfare development centers for older persons are the agencies responsible for the provision of services for older persons. Each center serves as a place where older persons can meet and do activities together. It is also a place where older persons can apply for services that they might need. Activities that raised the awareness of older persons with regard to their own value were organized. Through the



year, several activities had been promoted by the centers to the extent that they were prepared for standard assessment and for becoming a model of social welfare service providing for older persons and a learning center where other agencies could visit and learn from its past and present experience. There were totally 59,476 persons who benefited from the services or activities as compared to the set target of 51,630 persons.



Key Activity 2: Organizing community-based preparation activities for older persons – Under this key activity, the following 3 activities were implemented. There were totally 46,308 persons who were involved as compared to the set target of 36,200 persons. The details are as follows:



- The organizing of community-based preparation activities for persons prior to becoming ageing community members – The aim was to provide older persons-to-be in communities with knowledge and better understanding about how to prepare themselves in advance in order to become older persons who could enjoy a good quality of life physically and mentally. It also included



the knowledge of how to be well-prepared as far as housing conditions were concerned, how to manage cash income and saving for future security so that they would not be a burden to the family, how to be provided with services while maintaining human dignity and



how to keep themselves happy for the rest of their life. There were 3 types of activity that were carried out for older persons: activities relating to the provision of knowledge, activities relating to the enhancement of skills and activities relating to their participation in social activities.

Compare to the set target of 30,000 persons, there were totally 38,930 persons who were involved.

- The organizing of activities by community-based service centers for older persons – Focus was on encouraging communities to make arrangements for places within communities where older persons could do activities together, places where they could share experiences, meet each other or hear the news and information about older persons. Compare to the set target of 400 persons, there were totally 547 persons who were involved.



- The provision of welfare services for older persons who were in difficult circumstances – The aim was to provide assistance for older persons facing various difficulties such as lack of daily necessities etc. Cash assistance was available for low-income families and the destitute. Compare to the set target of 5,800 persons, there were totally 6,831 persons who were provided with services.



Key Activity 3: Promoting activities relating to care given to young children by older persons – Under this key activity, the following 2 activities had been carried out. Compare to the set target of 7,500 persons, there were totally 8,713 persons who

participated in activities. The details were as follows:

- The transfer of wisdom and attention paid to younger family members. This particular activity aimed at making use of older persons' experience and wisdom that could make further contribution and increase income, enabling children and youth to be closer to older persons and recognize the value of older persons and protecting the wisdom of older persons such that it would not be threatened with distinction but passed on and even become more developed.



- Care given by older persons to younger family members – The aim was to develop a bond of relationship between people who were from different generations, link the process of learning such that it provided children with knowledge in all aspects and enable older persons to spend their leisure time constructively to benefit themselves, their communities and society as a whole. Compare to the set target of 4,000 persons, there were totally 6,831 persons who participated.



Outcome against target

Persons in communities were prepared prior to crossing the threshold of aging. They gained knowledge about how to prepare themselves in order to become older persons with good quality of life physically and mentally, how to adjust housing conditions, how to manage cash income and saving for future security so that they would not be a burden to the family. Each center organized several activities to make older persons recognize their own value and contribution which, on the whole, made the center well-prepared for standard assessment and for playing the role of a model center for social welfare service providing for older persons



The implementation of activities in response to strategy 4: Strengthening the prevention of social problems and welfare protection for persons who are affected by the problems and prone to risks

Output: The output was the target population who were provided with services relating to the prevention and protection against human trafficking

Output against target:

The output was the target population who were provided with services relating to the prevention and protection against human trafficking. The





overall set target was 107,130 beneficiaries and the actual output was 108,136 beneficiaries or 100.94% of the set target. To achieve the output, 4 key activities were implemented of which the details are as follows:

Key Activity 1: Preventing the problem of human trafficking – Focus was on raising public awareness and understanding about the danger of human trafficking, increasing knowledge and better understanding about the current situation relating to human trafficking and formulating relevant projects. These projects were aimed at

preventing the problem of human trafficking, building the capacity of the target groups, enhancing their vocational skills and improving their quality of life such that they became self-reliant, well-informed and aware of the danger brought about by the group of people engaging in human trafficking. Supervision and follow-up activities were carried out under a project on service by a one-stop service center for victims of human trafficking at Suvarnabhumi Airport. Arrangements had been made to arrange a space for a one-stop service center within the international terminal of the airport to offer non-stop assistance for Thai people who encountered problems and were sent back home from abroad. Other activities included the follow-up and evaluation of the standard of services as provided by 8 welfare protection and occupational development centers and the implementation of activities in response to the commitments for bilateral cooperation under the MoUs between Thailand and countries within the Mae-khong Sub-region for the prevention, assistance and protection for victims of human trafficking. Compare to the set target of 103,080 persons, there were totally 103,178 persons



who benefitted from this key activity.

Key Activity 2: Developing the life skills of street children – This was promoted by building and developing the life skills of street children so that they could lead a decent life. Cooperation had been maintained with networks working with street children in the organizing of EQ

development activities. Compare to the set target of 150 persons, there were totally 150 persons who benefitted from implementing the activity.



Key Activity 3: Rehabilitating and building the capacity of the destitute, beggars and the high-risk groups to protect them from being lured – A working group and a committee were set up to select target areas where qualified persons were chosen to participate in vocational training courses based on the nature of problems, needs and willingness to participate in the training. The aim of this key activity was to provide the destitute and population in the high-risk groups with welfare protection as well as the protection of their rights and to prevent them from becoming victims of human trafficking. It also aimed to provide the target groups with knowledge and sufficient income and to increase common understanding among families and communities concerning care for the destitute, homeless and high-risk groups who were prone to the problem of human trafficking. By implementing the activity, they could enhance their capacity to lead a better life and avoid the risk of being the victims of



human trafficking. Compare to the set target of 3,100 persons, there were totally 3,837 persons who benefitted.

Key Activity 4: Solving the problem of human trafficking under the guidelines of 5P and 4R – The first 5P stands for policy, protection, prevention, prosecution and partnership while the 4R stands for rescue, recovery, repatriation and reintegration. Such guidelines were used in order to provide welfare protection and assistance for victims of human trafficking. Prime consideration had been given unfailingly to the processes that were involved starting from the identification of trafficked victims; transfer of the victims to agencies under the Department where services relating to welfare protection and assistance were provided for them which included safe shelters, physical and psychological rehabilitation, legal assistance; cooperation with agencies at field level or the countries of origin to conduct family assessment to see whether the families of the trafficked victims were prepared for their return; protection

of the rights of the victims according to the law; assistance to prepare the trafficked victims before their safe return to their domicile or countries of origin, protection of the victims from being re-trafficked to constant follow-up and care for the injured persons. Compare to the set target of 800 persons, there were totally 971 persons who benefitted from implementing this key activity.



Strategic Issue 2: Developing the capacity of the target groups to enable them to lead their life in society amid various social changes

To implement the strategic issue of developing the capacity of the target groups to enable them to lead their life in society amid various social changes, the Department of Social development and Welfare adopted the following 2 strategies:

Strategy 1: Strengthening welfare protection and developing the capacity of families; **Strategy 2:** Enhancing and developing the capacity of the target groups in making a living.



The implementation of activities in response to strategy 1: Strengthening welfare protection and developing the capacity of families

Output: The output was the target population who were provided with protection and capacity development contributing to the strengthening of families.





Output against target:

The output was the target population who were provided with protection and capacity development contributing to the strengthening of families. The overall set target was 96,890 beneficiaries and the actual output was 114,394 beneficiaries or 118.07% of the set target. To achieve the output, 4 key activities were

implemented of which the details are as follows:

Key Activity 1: Preventing domestic violence and protecting the victims of domestic violence – Services were provided by shelters for children and families which had totally 77 service units. These services, which covered temporary accommodation, physical and psychological rehabilitation, were made available to children and families who faced social and immediate problems. The aim was to enable them to lead their life in society by rendering services at the shelters for children and families. Compare to the set target of 3,190 persons, there were totally 8,655 persons who received services as provided by the shelters for children and families.



Key Activity 2: Providing welfare protection and assistance by a one-stop crisis center for the prevention of domestic violence A working system was developed by the center for the prevention of domestic violence under the Department of Social Development



and Welfare which could offer services for a total of 6,217 persons as compared to the set target of 3,700 persons.

Key Activity 3: Improving the quality of life of people from 3 generations – In 2012, the overall target was 90,000 persons and the actual output was 99,522 persons. The details are as follows:



- Improvement of the quality of life of people from 3 generations in the area of the Royal Project 904 under the Bond of Family Love Project: Project activities were organized to improve the quality of life of people from 3 generations. Other projects were also carried out including a project to honor Her Majesty the Queen entitled “Roi Jai... Roi Ma Lai...Roi Larn Duang Jai...Terd Tai Ra Chi Nee” (Weaving hearts...Weaving garlands of flowers...Millions of hearts



honor Her Majesty the Queen), projects to promote a healthy child growth i.e. a project for parents that concerned telling stories, reading and playing with their children, activities about children exploring the world “Inventing toys which can fly”.



- Improvement of the quality of life of the people from 3 generations under the Project to Strengthen the Tie of Three Generations and the Bond of Family Love: Project activities were implemented and guided by 5 key concepts: 1). Prepare well before marriage – focus was on psychological,

social and custom/tradition aspects as well as public awareness regarding the importance of being well-prepared before marriage 2). Learn together from early pregnancy – focus was on healthy mother and child development during pregnancy, preparation of mothers and families for child care and provision of knowledge about hygienic and health care 3). Think creatively since early childhood – focus was on steps of proper child and youth development that were suitable for each particular age group 4). Maintain good family support physically and mentally – focus was on activities relating to surveillance, prevention and solving of family problems and 5). Promote the role of older persons in weaving the bond of family love – focus was on promoting and encouraging older persons to keep a good level of status, roles and quality of life, be able to live happily with their families and communities while maintaining their own value and human dignity.



Key Activity 4: Implementing a district-level family capacity building (family clinic) project – The project was implanted in areas within 18 provinces. The results from conducting a nationwide survey on the strength of families covering a total sample of approximately 12,591 families (information obtained from a strong family standard system of the Office of Women's Affairs and Family Development on 17 September 2012) revealed that 82.00% of the samples in 18 districts were above the strong family standard criteria or equal to 3.67 marks.

Outcome against target

The target population was provided with welfare protection and capacity building contributing to the formulation of strong families. This could be achieved by improving the working system of the



one-stop crisis center for the prevention of domestic violence which involved services made available by 77 service units of the shelters for children and families. They offered such services as temporary accommodation, physical and psychological rehabilitation to children and families that faced social and immediate problems which enabled them to lead their life in society.



The implementation of activities in response to strategy 2: Enhancing and developing the capacity of the target groups in making a living.

Output: The output was the target population whose capacity was enhanced and developed.

Output against target:

The output was the target population whose capacity was enhanced and developed. The overall set target was 1,052,192 beneficiaries and the actual output was 1,233,014 beneficiaries or 117.19% of the set target. To achieve the output, 9 key activities were implemented of which the details are as follows:

Key Activity 1: Enhancing the capacity of highland population in





making a living – In 2012, An activity which was implemented under the Buddhist Mission Project was the organizing of a mass ordination ceremony for 286 men from various tribal groups in the highlands i.e. the Karen, the Hmong, the Akha, the Lahu, the Yao, the Khamu, the H'tin, the Lawa, the Lisu, the Thai and other ethnic minority

groups living in remote and in accessible rural areas of 14 northern and western provinces with the aim to make the results further contribute to the security of nation, religion and the monarchy institutions. The mass ordination ceremony which was held at Benjamaborpit Temple was organized to pay a tribute on the occasion of His Majesty the King's birthday on December 5, 2012, the 80th birthday anniversary of Her Majesty the Queen on August 12, 2012 and the 60th birthday anniversary of Crown Prince Maha Vajiralongkorn on July 28, 2012. Under the Thai constitution, the hill tribes are regarded as being Thai citizens with unique identity in several dimensions which are different from the lowland population whether seen from their living condition, culture, tradition, custom, beliefs, dialects for communication and other limitations. Compare to the set target of 511,925 persons, there were 511,955 who participated in the activity.

Key Activity 2: Enhancing the capacity of population in the target areas in making a living – Communities in these specific areas are located within 44 self-help land settlements of 33 provinces. Land had been allocated to these communities under the Land Allocation Act B.E.2511 with the aim to enhance and develop their capacity such that they became more secure in making a living, had the capacity to make use of land for farm and non-farm activities more effectively. Areas within the self elpland settlements





need to be developed continuously so that members feel secure in making a living. In addition, relevant documents need to be prepared correctly according to the set criteria. From 1 October 2011– 30 September 2012, there were 3,825 persons who were granted membership and placed in 4,518 plots of land covering a total area of 28,413 rai and land use

documents (Nor-Khor 3) were issued to 7,791 persons, covering 9,832 plots of land in a total area of 77,867 rai. Compare to the set target of 160,167 persons, there were 160,167 who benefitted from the activity.

Key Activity 3: Making services available at participatory-based social service centers: Compare to the set target of 110,000 persons, there were 110,000 who benefitted from the activity.

Key Activity 4: Enhancing the capacity of communities in the southern provinces to live in harmony – A project on district mobile team services had been developed to offer remedy for persons affected by the disturbances in the southern provinces. Services were provided in the 5 provinces of Yala, Pattani, Narathiwat, Satul and Song Khla which included those relating to counseling, visit and assistance provided within the scope of duties of the Ministry or service relating to the referral of cases to other agencies concerned for further assistance. Services which were provided had resulted in the increase of morale and spirit of persons who were affected by the situation, their participation in problem solving and better attitude towards the public sector. Compare to the set target of 14,600 persons, there were 21,527 who benefitted from the activity.



Another project that had been implemented in 2012 was the strengthening

of driving forces to develop areas in the southern provinces (enhance the capacity of communities in the southern provinces to live in harmony). The project aimed to offer remedy service to children, youth, women, old, widows who were affected by the disturbances and to encourage the youth and community members regardless of their race and religion to participate in activities that were beneficial to all in order to bring about unity leading to the strengthening and peace in communities. Compare to the set target of 10,000 persons, there were 10,000 who benefitted from the activity.



Key Activity 5: Enhancing the capacity of the target groups in areas under the district social welfare and development model – To achieve the objective of the key activity, the project on the district social welfare and development model was seen as a mechanism that could enhance the capacity of the target population. The project adopted a 5- pronged approach implemented under the Bond of Family Love Project to build a process for project implementation covering such activities as breast feeding, household hygiene, warm and caring family, occupational development along the principle of sufficiency economy and capacity development for the target groups. All activities were geared towards strengthening families, communities and local organizations and enabling them to proceed towards sustainability which



responded to the driving forces to move the Thai society towards becoming a welfare society and a welfare for all society. Compare to the set target of 975 districts, there were 975 districts where the project had been implemented.

Key Activity 6: Enhancing the capacity of ethnic groups – The Festival of



Indigenous Peoples in Thailand for the year 2012 was held at IMPACT Muang Thong Thanee Conference Center during August 2-4, 2012. Organizing the festival whether at field, regional or national levels was regarded as being very important and necessary for it opened up opportunity for various ethnic groups to learn from each other and to share knowledge on the technical, cultural

identity, way of life and socio-economic aspects. This sharing of knowledge would lead to the goal which was an end result of a value chain analysis which was "Ethnic groups develop their quality of life, maintain their unique cultural identity and are accepted by the society at large". Compare to the set target of 28 tribal groups, there were 28 tribal groups that were involved.

Key Activity 7: Implementing a project social welfare service providing to complete the people's life – Certain project activities were carried out in 18 provinces, for example, providing knowledge required to make a living, funds as well as raw materials to start income-generating activities, working out a household income/expenditure account. The aim of such provision was to increase income of the people to be above the poverty line. It was found that people in the target areas faced several social problems of which the severity could be ranked as follows: 1). The problem of poverty in communities; 2). The problem arising from divorce; 3). The problem of older persons being left alone; 4). The problem of persons with disabilities; 5). The problem of children and youth; 6). The problem of indebtedness and; 7). The problem of women. Compare to the set target of 1,000 persons, there were 1,000 persons who benefitted from the project.

Key Activity 8: Enhancing the capacity of people living in urban communities to



ensure life security

– They were activities that involved the provision of welfare protection and development for people living in Bangkok by community welfare protection centers. These centers played the role of a coordinator who maintained contact with networks in communities for the provision of assistance and care for people facing problems or those who were in distress. A project that was geared towards enhancing the capacity of people living in urban communities to ensure life security also included a study visit activity which involved arrangements made for community leaders and community members to visit places to raise awareness with regard to development of their own communities and the spirit of being volunteers. There were a total of 70,500 persons who participated in the activity.



Key Activity 9: Improving the quality of life along the community way of life – This particular key activity, which was implemented successively as a continuation from the project on enhancing the capacity of people living in urban communities to ensure life security, involved a selection of community leaders to participate in 2-day training which was concerning with how to prepare development plans for their communities, study visit about sufficiency economy to give them ideas and learn how to put them into actual practice within the context of their own communities. It also involved financial support for people facing problems nationwide to start income generating activities. Under this activity, there were a total of 347,825 persons who participated.



Strategic Issue 3: Working in an integrated manner with networks/ partners to enhance the creation of a welfare society

A strategy was adopted by the Department of Social Development and Welfare to promote Strategic Issue 3 which involved working in an integrated manner with networks/partners to enhance the creation of a welfare society.



The implementation of activities in response to strategy 1: promoting and supporting participation by local organizations and communities in social activities

Output: The output was the networks well-equipped with capacity that had been enhanced and developed.

Output against target:

The output was the networks well-equipped with capacity that had been enhanced and developed. The overall set target was 876 networks and the actual output was 876 networks or 100% of the set target. To achieve the output, 4 key activities were implemented of which the details are as follows:

Key Activity 1: Strengthening networking systems – A total of 341 networks at district level were encouraged to work together in order to push activities



forward with the aim to establish linkage of activities that proceeded systematically, minimize overlapping and build the strength to help each other more effectively.

Key Activity 2: Monitoring and developing the capacity of networks – This was done by conducting follow-up and evaluation of network performance leading to the strengthening of the capacity of networks to the extent that they were qualified to be registered as non-profit public or community welfare organizations. With such status, they could request for budget from the public sector or other agencies concerned which enabled the networks to become self-reliant on a sustainable basis. The overall set target was 295 networks and the actual output was 295 networks.

Key Activity 3: Promoting social welfare service providing approaches among networks – Support was given to networks and local organizations to develop their own social welfare service providing approaches. Each approach should be designed to fit within the context and needs of each local community. The overall set target was 120 networks and the actual output was 120 networks.

Key Activity 4: Providing and enhancing technical support for social development and welfare – 7 Projects were implemented as follows:

- A project on building capacity of networks to be further registered as non-profit public or community welfare organizations which involved a total of 428 networks;

- A research project on impact arising from crossing the threshold of the ASEAN community, how it affected





local communities/organizations and how they were prepared for that which involved a total of 4,560 participants from 228 districts;

- A project on organizing an academic forum on social development and welfare to present papers and provide networks with opportunity to have the floor where they could share knowledge about the implementation of social development and welfare contributing to the work in that particular field;

- A project on knowledge management concerning social development and welfare focusing on lessons learned from past performance of which the body of knowledge and experiences gained were collected and put in 12 learning kits ready to be further distributed and used by networks and agencies concerned;

- A project on developing integrated social development and welfare plans at provincial cluster level which was the annual planning preparation exercise on integrated social development and welfare of the field-level organizations under the Department of Social Development and Welfare to be used by each agency as a document required to be submitted for annual budget allocation and for preparing an action plan of the Department;

- A study project on participation by organizations in the business sector in helping the society at large which was a study of guidelines and methods of how to involve business organizations numbering totally 24 organizations (12 were large size and 12 were small size) unfailingly in CSR activities conducted with the aim was to develop a proper approach geared towards promoting





successful business sector participation leading to broader project extension in the future;

- A review of an annual research master plan which was drawn up with the aim to adjust the 5-year master plan on social development and welfare research (2012-2016)

to be in line with current social situation, policies, strategies and mission of the Department. In addition to that, a proposal for research projects was developed to be used for submitting a request for budget allocation for the year 2014 from the Office of the National Research Commission.

Outcome against target :

The outcome was the work carried out by networks concerning the management of knowledge leading to the organizing of a lessons learned exercise to obtain knowledge relating to social development and welfare to be further used for strengthening the capacity of networks such that they could be registered as non-profit public or community welfare organizations.



Performing of the Task Assigned by the Government



In the fiscal year 2012, the Thai Government assigned a task of paying compensation for persons affected by political unrest to the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security, through the Department of Social Development and Welfare. The aim was to compensate and rehabilitate persons who were politically affected along the concept of harmonizing

and social justice leading to national reconciliation. The criteria and methods of providing cash assistance on humanitarian grounds for persons affected by political unrest during 2005-2010 had been developed which would be applied to persons who were classified to be in group 1 (those who were physically injured or dead). On January 10, 2012, the Cabinet agreed in principle on the framework of cash assistance and subsequently agreed on March 6, 2012 regarding the criteria and methods of providing cash assistance as proposed by the Truth for Reconciliation Commission of Thailand within the budget of 2,000 million baht. In this connection, the Department of Social Development and Welfare was designated to be the registration and reimbursement unit. From 8 March – 10 December 2012, registration was open to the public and the results were as follows:

1) The number of cases registered in Bangkok: 4,906 cases

2) The number of cases registered at the shelters for children and families located nationwide: 1,225 cases



There were totally 6,161 persons from Bangkok and other provinces who registered and classified as being persons affected by political unrest during 2005 – 2010 under the criteria that had been set.

An Evaluation Project on the Outcome of Activities/Projects/Programs Implemented by the Department of Social Development and Welfare in 2011 concerning the evaluation of the Department's overall performance, the Department of Social Development and Welfare hired a team of consultants from the Policy and Management Development Institute, Faculty of Political Science, Chulalongkorn University to carry out an evaluation project on the outcome of implementing activities/projects/programs by the Department of Social Development and Welfare during the year 2011. The project aims to produce and provide the department with an evaluation report on the outcome of implementing activities/projects/programs by the Department of Social Development and Welfare in 2011 at output, outcome and impact levels. It is also aimed to obtain the results of which key findings can be further proposed to top-level administrators for proper decision making on necessary adjustment which might be required to improve the outcome of implementing future activities relating to the provision of social development and welfare to become more effective and efficient. In addition to that, it is expected that the project will offer useful comments or recommendations for developing the process of rational thinking along the principle of evaluation at output, outcome and impact levels that is both effective and systematic. The results can be summarized as follows:





1. Output issues: At output level, the output reached the target that had been set whether seen from the points of view of quantity, quality, timeframe and costs that were involved. Considering each category or issue of output that had been produced, it was found that achievements made could be ranked as follows: Output 2 – The target population were provided with welfare services (218.59 %), Output 7

– The target population were provided with welfare protection and their capacity had been developed contributing to the strengthening of family institution (185.67 %), Output 4 – The target population were provided with knowledge and occupational development (119.05 %), Output 8 – The target population were provided with welfare services for older persons (115.52 %), Output 6 – The target population were provided with prevention and welfare protection against human trafficking (114.31 %), Output 1 – Children and youth were provided with knowledge and suitable family environment (112.10 %), Output 3 – The capacity of the target population was promoted and enhanced (100 %) and Output 5 – The capacity of the social welfare and development networks was promoted and enhanced (100 %).

2. Outcome issues: The overall picture of performance by the Department of Social Development and Welfare on the outcome issues shall mean the targets of service providing by the Department comprising (1) The target population were provided with social welfare services and capacity building (2) Children and youth were well-equipped with appropriate capacity (3) Local areas and communities participated in social activities (4) The target population were provided with prevention and welfare protection against social-related problems and risks (5) Older persons were provided with services and opportunity to participate in social activities in line with the set targets whether seen from the points of view of quantity, quality, timeframe and costs that were involved. When classified





by the targets of service providing by the Department of Social Development and Welfare, it was found that achievements made could be ranked as follows: the target population were provided with social welfare services and capacity building (144.01 %), the target population were provided with prevention and welfare protection against social-related problems and risks (119.77 %), older persons were provided with services and opportunity to participate in social activities (115.52 %), children and youth were well-equipped with appropriate capacity (112.10 %), local areas and communities participated in social activities (100 %).

3. Impact issues: The overall picture of performance by the Department of Social Development and Welfare on the impact issues shall mean the targets of service providing by the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security comprising (1) The target population were provided with social welfare services (2) Children and youth developed life skills and healthy growth suitable with their age (3) The target population were provided with development and protection according to the rights they are entitled to (4) Older persons had access to social security in line with the set targets whether seen from the points of view of quantity, quality, timeframe and costs that were involved. When classified by the targets of service providing by the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security, it was found that achievements made could be ranked as follows: the target population were provided with social welfare services (144.01 %), older persons had access to social security (115.52 %), children and youth developed life skills and healthy growth suitable with their age (112.10 %), the target population were provided with development and protection according to the rights they are entitled to (109.89 %).
