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Department of Social Development and Welfare

1.1 The Action Plan of the Department of Social Development and Welfare, Ministry of Social Development and Human Security (2010-2013)

Vision

"To be the core organization for the provision of social development and welfare with all sectors within society being involved under the standard and effective management system targeting towards self-reliance of the target groups"

Mission

1. Formulate and develop the system of standard social welfare service providing;
2. Provide the target groups with prevention, problem-solving, rehabilitation, welfare protection and capacity building services;
3. Promote and support the social development and welfare networking system and maintain coordination for the provision of suitable social development and welfare in each area;
4. Develop an effective, efficient and standard management system.

Strategic Issues

Strategic Issue 1: Developing the models and methods of social welfare service providing for the target groups

Purpose: There are models and methods of social welfare service providing that covers all target groups.

Indicators:

1. The number of new models and methods of social welfare service providing
2. The percentage of organizations that make use of the new models and methods of social welfare service providing as developed by the Department of Social Development and Welfare

Strategy: Promoting the development of models and methods of providing social welfare services for the target groups

Strategic Issue 2: Building the capacity of the target groups in making a living

Purpose: The target groups which have been provided with social welfare services have the capacity to make a living.

Indicators:

1. The percentage of the target groups who are provided with social welfare services and have the quality of life above the standard criteria

Strategy:

1. Providing children and youth with more knowledge and suitable family environment
2. Promoting and providing social welfare services for the target groups
3. Promoting and building the capacity of the target groups in making a living
4. Strengthening the prevention of social problems and welfare protection for persons who are affected by the problems and prone to risks



Strategic Issue 3: Promoting social welfare service providing and social security for older persons

Purpose: Older persons who are provided with welfare and capacity building services can live in society as valuable members.

Indicators:

1. The percentage of older persons who are provided with welfare services and have the quality of life above the standard criteria
2. The percentage of older persons with developed capacity who participate in social development according to the standard criteria

Strategy: Building the capacity of older persons and improving social welfare service providing for older persons

Strategic Issue 4: Promoting the networking of social development and welfare organizations

Purpose: Local areas and communities where promotion and support has been given participate in the provision of welfare and social development.

Indicators:

1. The percentage of local communities / areas / networks with capacity that has been enhanced and developed are involved in the provision of welfare and social development above the standard criteria

Strategy: Promoting and supporting participation by local areas and local communities in the provision of welfare and social development

Strategic Issue 5: Promoting the application of good governance principles in organization management

Purpose: Personnel and the public at large have confidence in DSDW's administration

Indicators:

1. The level of achievement with regard to quality improvement of the public organization management at the level not less than 4

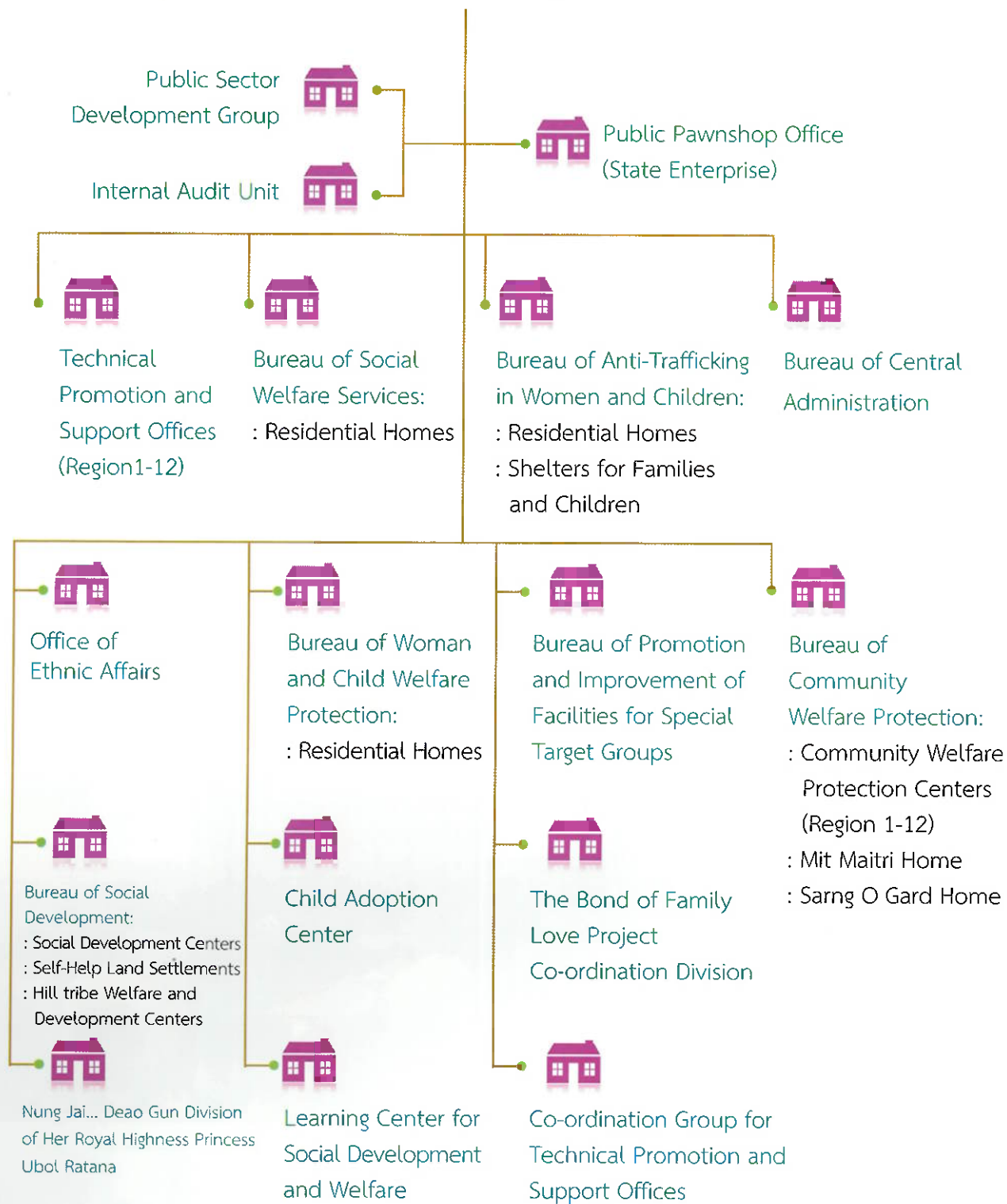

Part II

The Outcome of Activity/Project/Program
Implementation by DSDW



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2.1 The Outcome of Implementing Activities/Projects/Programs by the Department of Social Development and Welfare According to the Performance Agreement in the Fiscal Year 2010

An evaluation of the Department's performance in the fiscal year 2009 conducted by the Office of the Public Sector Development Commission revealed that, on the whole, it scored 4.3758 marks. The results can be broken down into the following dimensions:

Dimension 1: Effectiveness of Activities/Projects/Programs as Compared to the Action Plan

To reach the goal of this particular dimension, 7 common indicators were developed by the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security to be used by all organizations that are under the Ministry. Each organization was assigned to be the host agency for an indicator or a number of indicators. Taking all indicators into consideration, the Department got 4.1902 marks out of the total 5.0000 marks. As for the 7 indicators under the Department's responsibility as being the host agency, it scored a total of 4.8850 marks out of the total 5.0000 marks.

For this dimension, the Department got the overall score of 4.5376.

Dimension 2: Quality of Services

To reach the goal of this particular dimension, the Department had a process to improve the quality of services provided for its clients which involved measuring the satisfaction of the clients. A survey was conducted by the National Statistic Office to find out the level of clients' satisfaction towards 3 services/activities, namely those relating to older persons in communities who were prepared to be involved in saving activities aiming towards promoting community-based welfare services for older persons, promotion and support for private-run child care centers and 6-month vocational training for women. The overall satisfaction was 85.87 %. In addition, the bureaus / divisions / centers within the Department had opened up opportunity for the general public to be involved in the implementation of such services or activities whether by expressing their views, providing recommendations or comments that further led to improvement or taking part in the follow-up and monitoring. A management system that helped process the complaints against the organization itself was also developed to deal with cases which emerged.

For this dimension, the Department got the overall score of 4.1150.



Dimension 3: Efficiency of Activities/Projects/programs

To reach the goal of this particular dimension, focus of the Department was on the proper management of budget covering the disbursement of budget in the investment category, the overall expenditure and the disbursement of budget according to the Action Plan of the Stimulus Package. Other attempts made to further enhance efficiency included producing a list of unit cost and implementing measures that reduced electricity and energy consumption and measures for internal control to minimize the potential risks arising from operation carried out by the Department.

The Department also proceeded with action to improve the law that would facilitate provision of better services for its clients. The law entitled "Regulation of the Department of Social Development and Welfare on Welfare Fund for the Needy B.E. 2547 (2004)" covered maintaining the standard concerning time spent on processing services. The aims were to facilitate provision of services and to further extend the outcome of improving 5 processes of service providing after its latest development in 2005. The processes were submitted to the Office of Public Sector Development Commission and two of them were subsequently awarded. One was the 4-dimension process to bring happiness back to older persons (Happy Home) run by Ban Bang Khae Social Welfare Development Center for Older Persons which won a consolation prize in the category of service providing process development and the other was the process of innovative child care for orphans aged from new born babies to 5 years old developed by Payathai Home for Babies which won a grand prize in the category of innovative service development.

For this dimension, the Department got the overall score of 4.6299.

Dimension 4: Organization Development

The Department used the quality management criteria of the Public Sector Management Quality Award (PMQA) as a framework for self-assessment and an instrument for follow-up and evaluation of the Department's management for the purpose of improving and upgrading the management quality. As for 2010, emphasis was on development as described in Section 1- Leadership and Section 5 - Human Resource Focus.

For this dimension, the Department got the overall score of 4.1859.

2.2 The Results of Activities/Projects/Programs Implemented by the Department of Social Development and Welfare under the Action Plan for the Fiscal Year 2010

The activities/projects/programs implemented by the Department of Social Development and Welfare under the 4-year Action Plan (2009-2012) for the Fiscal Year 2010 yielded the following results which were classified according to the Department's 5 strategic issues. As far as Strategic Issue 5 was concerned, it involved promoting the application of good governance principles in organization management proceeded in the form of main and supporting activities that linked with Strategic Issues 1-4 such that the efficiency and set goal under the plan could be subsequently achieved. The results are as follows:

Strategic Issue 1: Developing the models and methods of social welfare service providing for the target groups

To promote the strategic issue of developing the models and methods of social welfare service providing for the target groups, the Department of Social Development and Welfare adopted the guideline involving the implementation of a project to provide social welfare services for the target groups which was connected with the Strategic Issue 1.

Strategic guideline: Promoting the development of social welfare service providing models and methods for the target groups

Major plan/ project/activity: A project to provide social welfare services for the target groups

Output against target:

The output of the project was that the target population was provided with social welfare services. The main activity was the development of social welfare service providing models and methods for the target groups with the overall target of the activity covering the following 4 subjects and 4 subsequent results:



1. The study of community-based service providing standard
2. The study of institution-based service providing standard to be used by shelters for children and families
3. Follow-up and evaluation of the outcome
4. The development of a prototype on social welfare and development

Outcome against target

The shelters for children and families, institutions and communities adopted the models of providing standard social welfare services and extended the coverage of model in the manner that was consistent and suitable with services for different target groups.

Strategic Issue 2: the capacity of the target population in making a living

There were 4 strategic guidelines adopted by the Department of Social Development and Welfare to promote Strategic Issue 2:

1. Increasing knowledge and suitable family environment for children and youth
2. Promoting and providing social welfare services for the target groups
3. Building the capacity of the target population in making a living
4. Strengthening the prevention and welfare protection for persons who are affected by social problems and prone to risks.

Strategic guideline 1: Increasing knowledge and suitable family environment for children and youth

1.1 Major plan/project/activity: A project to increase knowledge and suitable family environment for children and youth

1.2 Output against target:

The output under the project was that the knowledge and suitable family environment of children and youth had been increased. The overall set target was 121,895 beneficiaries and the actual output was 160,251 beneficiaries or 131.47% of the set target. To achieve the output, 7 key activities were implemented of which the details are as follows:



Key Activity 1: Improving the environment within private-run child care centers for pre-school children – The aim was to promote better knowledge and skills of the private-run child care operators, child care workers, parents and guardians of children who acquired services at private-run child care/ child welfare centers. It was also the aim of this Key Activity to encourage private-run child care/ child welfare centers to improve the quality of their services. In 2010, there were 11,900 persons who benefitted from the implementation of this Key Activity as compared to the set target of 11,770 persons or 101.10% of the set target.

Key Activity 2: Promoting and supporting the placement of children in adoptive / foster families – Focus was on children who were no longer able to live with their families or those who were under institutional

care of welfare homes. These children were placed in new families to ensure that they would be properly brought up and provided with warm love and care by adoptive / foster families. The overall target was 7,725 children and the actual output was 8,125 children or 105.18 % of the set target. These children can be classified as follows:

- 2.1 A total of 3,430 children were placed permanently in adoptive families
- 2.2 The remaining 4,695 children were placed temporarily in foster families

Key Activity 3: Improving the quality of life of people from 3 generations under the Bond of Family Love Project – In 2010, the overall target was 65,400 persons and the actual output was 99,293 persons or 151.82 % of the set target. The details are as follows:

3.1 Improvement of the quality of life of 6,057 persons living within the area of the Royal Project 904 of which the details are as follows:

3.1.1 Activities, carried out by the Sritaweerak Center and participated by a total of 1,658 persons, included provision of social welfare services for older persons and families i.e. activities that promoted good health and better nutrition, arts, national culture and tradition, entertainment, recreation, religion and social welfare services;

3.1.2 Activities, carried out by Dipangkorn Rasmijoti Child Development Center for a total of 1,549 children, included those relating to the promotion of a healthy child growth at each level of age group i.e. a group of very young children (1-2 years old), a group of preschool children (2-3 years old) such as activities that enhanced child development intellectually, emotionally and socially;

3.2 Improvement of the quality of life of 5,732 persons living in communities of which the details are as follows:

3.2.1 Activities, with a total of 2,532 participants, carried out under the Project on Parents' Story Telling, Reading and Playing with their Children and involved the organizing of training to promote the concepts about child intelligence quotient (IQ) development and to promote the role of parents in such development by reading-telling stories and playing with children, the production of communication media to disseminate knowledge, follow-up and evaluation in 11 provinces, namely Lampang, Uttaradit, Nakhorn Sawan, Nakhorn Ratchasima, Surat Thani, Ang Thong, Nakhorn Pathom, Chon Buri, Buri Ram, Kalasin and Songkhla;

3.2.2 Activities, with a total of 100 participants, carried out under the Project on Community-based Social Service Providing for Older Persons, Persons with Disabilities and the Destitute in the forms of group home and home care covering activities relating to data collecting and analyzing, provision of knowledge and building of a common learning process among local networks, strengthening of the capacity of caregivers and families in caring for older persons, persons with disabilities and the destitute, building of a common learning process with regard to sharing of knowledge and experience among government officials and local networks, promotion and formulation of a family and community care process for older persons, persons with disabilities and the destitute and supervision to follow up and see how efficient services for the target groups were;





3.2.3 Development of a baseline data system for the target groups and families in areas under the Project to Strengthen the Tie of Three Generations and Weave the Bond of Family Love by conducting a survey with the aim to obtain information about members, analyze the nature of problems and needs of the target groups and produce a report indicating the status and improvement of the quality of life of 1,600 project members;

3.2.4 Activities, with a total of 1,500 participants, carried out under a campaign to promote the Project to Strengthen Tie of Three Generations and Weave the Bond of Family Love which involved the organizing of a family day, road show activities and a celebration to honor Her Majesty the Queen on the occasion of the 2010 National Mother's Day which was

entitled *"Roi Jai... Roi Ma Lai...Roi Larn Duang Jai...Terd Tai Ra Chi Nee"* (Weaving hearts...Weaving garlands of flowers...Millions of hearts honor Her Majesty the Queen).

3.3 Improvement of the quality of life of the people from 3 generations numbering 83,929 persons according to the Project to Strengthen the Tie of Three Generations and Weave the Bond of Family Love which was promoted with the aims to develop a center of combined development activities where the good quality of life of people proceeded continuously from one age group to another within a life cycle through an integrated and holistic approach and to set a good example of development in the project areas covering activities relating to a community and family survey; activities responding to the 5 concepts that guided the Project to Strengthen the Tie of Three Generations and Weave the Bond of Family Love i.e. *"Prepare well before marriage, learn together from early pregnancy, think creatively since early childhood, maintain good family support physically and mentally and promote the role of older persons in weaving the bond of family love"* ; and other social activities such as recreation, promotion of better hygienic and health care, occupational promotion, cultural and religious activities, promotion of lifelong learning.

3.4 Improvement of the quality of life of the 3 generations numbering 6,425 persons according to the learning center project carried out in Rachaburi Province under the umbrella of the project to promote the establishment of learning centers where knowledge about the Project to Strengthen the Tie of Three Generations and Weave the Bond of Family Love had been provided and involved activities characterized by the key roles the center had to play i.e. the roles of being a datacenter, a service center, a training center and a center where social welfare activities were organized, for example, those relating to recreation, promotion of better hygienic and health care, occupational promotion, cultural and religious activities, promotion of lifelong learning.

Key Activity 4: Building the capacity of children and youth under the Miracle of Life Project – The project aimed at building the potential and developing the creative leadership skills of children and youth, encouraging children and youth to make use of their work skills that had been enhanced for the benefit of the society at large and organizing international conferences to promote an exchange of views among those who worked with children and youth, to provide children and youth with opportunity and space where they could show their potential and interest within the limit of exquisite Thai culture and to extend the child and youth networks from local to global level. There were totally 10,800 persons participating in the project.

Key Activity 5: Establishing suitable learning and recreation centers for children and youth – Communities were encouraged to establish suitable learning and recreation centers for children and youth and to give support to activities that would enhance child development in the learning centers i.e. activities relating to creative arts, music, sports, training to provide knowledge for families, development of child and youth IQ and EQ. Such provision allowed children and youth to have floor to show their views and potential and to benefit from activities that enhanced the learning process outside classroom as well as a healthy child growth. There were totally 28,016 children and youth who gained benefit from this Key Activity.

Key Activity 6: Organizing activities for children and youth facing social problems at the Por Kla Khunatham (Cultivation of moral values) Institution, Kanchanaburi Province to enrich their knowledge and experience regarding moral values – Child and youth development was provided for a total of 190 boys and girls who completed education at primary level (grade 6) and lower secondary level (grade 9) nationwide, those who lived in families facing social problems, those who were the disadvantaged, deprived of warm love and livelihood security as viewed from the dimension

of moral values. Such provision included knowledge in regular school system, occupational skills, moral values and ethics which proceeded simultaneously. In addition, support was given for learning materials and equipment, school textbooks, school uniforms, accident/life insurance and fund raising to ensure that the “Ton Kla” or seedlings of young generation of today who are developed physically, mentally, socially and intellectually will grow up to be productive human resources in the Thai society in the future.

1.3 Outcome against target:

Children and youth developed a healthy growth suitable with each level of age group. They gained knowledge, enhanced their potential and developed physically, mentally, socially, emotionally. They were also able to adjust themselves with surrounding environment, to live harmoniously with the Thai way of life and to be well-prepared to deal properly with any social change they might have to encounter.

Strategic guideline 2: Promoting and providing social welfare services for the target groups

2.1 Major plan/project/activity: A project to provide social welfare services for the target groups

2.2 Output against target:

The output was that the target groups numbering 869,631 persons or 160.01% of the set target of 543,469 persons were provided with social welfare services which was the result from implementing 4 key activities. The detailed activities are as follows:

Key Activity 1: Providing institution-based welfare services - The overall target was 17,472 beneficiaries and the actual output was 19,770 beneficiaries or 113.15% of the set target. The details of this Key Activity are as follows:



1.1 Institution-based welfare services were provided for 7,683 children and youth which covered provision of services and facilities in such institutions as reception homes, residential homes, child welfare protection homes and vocational training centers, child development and rehabilitation centers. Services were available in several forms including:

1.1.1 Welfare services were provided in 25 residential homes, reception homes, child welfare protection homes and vocational training centers for totally 7,478 children and youth from new born babies to 18 years old. Services available included the provision of 4 basic necessities as well as all aspects of child and youth development to prepare them for reintegration with their families and society.

1.1.2 Welfare services were provided in 4 child development and rehabilitation centers for a total of 205 boys and girls from 6 – 18 years old who needed special medical treatment and rehabilitation services i.e. children with emotional/mental problems, aggressive behavior, mental health problems or those who had tendencies to commit suicide or hurting themselves. Services available included those relating to medical treatment, physical and mental rehabilitation and adjustment, education and vocational training.

1.2 Institution-based welfare services were provided for a total of 1,650 women in 4 welfare protection and occupational development centers for women covering welfare protection and assistance for women and children who faced the problems as identified in the Prevention and Suppression of Prostitution B. E. 2539 (1996) and other social problems i.e. unmarried pregnant women. Services available covered the provision of 4 basic necessities, education, vocational training and physical as well as mental rehabilitation. Assistance was also provided to help them reintegrate with their families and society. All services aimed towards enabling them to eventually become self-reliant.



1.3 Institution-based welfare services were provided for a total of 4,559 destitute persons in 11 reception homes and homes for the destitute which included welfare for the homeless, the destitute and beggars. Services available included provision of 4 basic necessities, physical as well as mental rehabilitation and vocational training to enable them to help themselves and to lead a normal life within society. Referral service to other concerned agencies for further assistance was also provided for this particular target group.

1.4 Institution-based welfare services were provided for a total of 4,889 persons in 13 homes (11 homes for persons with disabilities and 2 half-way homes for rehabilitating psychiatric patients) who had no one to care for or those who had been cared for improperly. Temporary accommodation was also available for person with disabilities and rehabilitating psychiatric patients who wished to obtain rehabilitation services at the homes covering the provision of 4 basic necessities, physical rehabilitation by doctors, education, vocational training, the organizing of recreation and social activities and the preparation of their physical and mental well-being so that they could become self-reliant and eventually integrate into society as valuable members.

1.5 Services were provided at 2 centers for persons with autism located in Khon Kaen Province and Nonthaburi Province. Persons with autism, aged more than 12 years old are qualified to apply for services which are available in the form of day care or temporary institutional care services (respite) involving health care, medical treatment, physical therapy, psychological and occupational rehabilitation, education, social, recreation, religious and other activities or services that were drawn up with the aim to benefit and enable persons with autism to lead their life within society. In 2010, services were provided for a total of 260 persons with autism.



1.6 In response to the Mental Health Act B.E. 2551 (2008), the institution-based welfare services for persons with disabilities and rehabilitating psychiatric patients were further extended to 5 homes for the destitute: 2 in Pathum Thani Province, 1 in Prachuap Khiri Khan Province, 1 in Phitsanulok Province and 1 in Saraburi Province. Services which were offered to a total of 869 persons included the provision of 4 basic necessities, physical and psychological rehabilitation to increase the ability of persons with disabilities and rehabilitating psychiatric patients to live with others within society.

1.7 A learning center to develop the skills of clients (known as “Ban Sorn Bin” or a house that teaches young birds to fly) was set up at Saraburi Province. Services were made available to a total of 42 clients who were referred from the homes for the destitute. These services included the provision of knowledge on how to lead an independent life while reducing the reliance on others and intensive skill development which they could make use of in daily life activities when they step into broader societies outside their own.

Key Activity 2: Providing community-based welfare services – The overall target of this Key Activity was 505,707 beneficiaries and the actual output was 827,491 beneficiaries or 163.63 % of the set target. The details are as follows:

2.1 Prevention and rehabilitation services were offered to persons who had gone through drug addiction treatment and those who were in the high risk groups at Ban Pak Jai, Saraburi Province. Activities which were carried out for a total of 120 persons included psychological rehabilitation and adjustment, capacity building and preparation of persons undergone the drug addiction treatment such that they were well-prepared to make a decent living, earn cash income and be able to live with their families and communities.

2.2 Welfare protection of the disadvantaged in urban communities was promoted by encouraging urban community leaders and other community members to unite in the form of saving groups and by strengthening the group power to serve as networks for protection of the disadvantaged’s rights so that (1) welfare services could be subsequently provided for the disadvantaged in 36 urban communities within Bangkok and (2) communities themselves could play a role in assisting and rendering welfare services to the target groups of disadvantaged children, youth, women and older persons numbering totally 878 cases.

2.3 Social welfare services were provided in communities for the target group of persons with disabilities of which the details are as follows:

2.3.1 Services were provided for a total of 45,140 persons in community - based rehabilitation centers for persons with disabilities;



2.3.2 Communities were encouraged to be involved in improving the household conditions of persons with disabilities within their own communities covering a total of 131 houses;

2.3.3 Support and capacity building were provided for a total of 278 care givers, helpers and sign language interpreters for persons with disabilities;

2.3.4 Social welfare service providing in the forms of group home and home care was made available for persons with disabilities in communities.

2.4 Various forms of welfare services were provided for a total of 391,827 persons with low income:

2.4.1 Cash assistance for a total of 267,771 persons

2.4.2 A campaign to raise funds and allocate in-kind assistance to ease problems faced by 105,855 persons with low income.

2.4.3 Temporary accommodation service was offered to 18,201 low-income travelers who were school or college students and people in general.

2.5 Various forms of welfare protection and assistance were provided for 73,585 persons facing social problems:

2.5.1 The following welfare protection and assistance was available for 61,897 persons;

- Assistance for 1,959 persons affected by the public disorder that began in 12nd March 2010

- Monthly cash assistance for a total of 119 persons with disabilities and those who became disabled and orphaned as a result from the public disorder that took place on 7th October 2008, 8-14th April 2009 and 12nd March 2010 onwards
- Assistance for 59,394 persons facing social problems in general

2.5.2 Cash assistance for assistive device of 1,583 persons with disabilities

2.5.3 Cash assistance for welfare and rehabilitation of 10,834 persons with disabilities

2.5.4 Cash assistance for 1,583 persons who were in distress to be used for sending them back to their domicile within the country

2.6 Community-based welfare services were provided for children and youth. The aim was to make services available so that children and youth could enjoy happiness and good quality of life in their families and communities and be provided with welfare protection service. A survey was conducted and assistance was provided for children who were not brought up properly by their families, those who were poor, homeless, abandoned, abused, commercially exploited and those who faced various problems or behaved improperly.

Provision of welfare services for families and communities was promoted and supported covering a total of 311,767 beneficiaries who were provided with services in several forms as follows:

2.6.1 Welfare services were provided for a total of 266,560 children living in poor families. The aim was to ease immediate problems encountered by the families by offering them scholarships for children, cash assistance to start income-generating activities, consumer goods for daily use, school uniforms and counseling service for parents or guardians of children with regard to proper child rearing.

2.6.2 Promotion and support was given to private-run child care centers and welfare homes in the forms of supplementary food and child development kits for the development of 45,207 children with the aim to ensure that they would be properly brought up and developed.



Key Activity 3: Providing social work and social welfare services relating to HIV/AIDS - The overall target was 16,290 persons and the actual output was 18,325 persons or 112.49% of the set target. The details of this Key Activity are as follows:

3.1 Welfare services were provided for a total of 17,899 persons in communities who were infected with or affected by HIV/AIDS. Services provided were in several forms as follows:

3.1.1 Assistance in the form of funding support to start income-generating activities was made available for totally 1,200 women affected by HIV/AIDS either infected with the disease or husbands died from or infected with the disease, those who were poor, had children to care for, lacked funds to make a living or faced other social problems. The aims were to enable them to support themselves and their families financially and to be able to live in communities and society.

3.1.2 In highland communities, assistance was provided for 500 persons infected with HIV/AIDS and their families in the form of cash to start income-generating activities with the aim to generate employment and income and to enable the HIV/AIDS infected persons/patients to lead their life within families and communities.

3.1.3 Child welfare assistance was provided in the form of cash for a total of 1,844 children who were infected or affected by HIV/AIDS to ease their problems, enable them to live in families and communities without being referred to be under institutional care.

3.1.4 Family welfare assistance was provided in the form of cash for a total of 14,355 persons who were infected or affected by HIV/AIDS and their families to ease their problems and enable them to be with their families.

3.2 Child welfare assistance was provided for a total of 336 children in 4 welfare homes who were infected or affected by HIV/AIDS which included the provision of 4 basic necessities and all aspects of child development suitable with their age to ensure that they were properly cared, developed and provided with protection for their basic rights.

3.3 Action was taken for the prevention of HIV/AIDS by providing knowledge for 90 responsible officials of involved agencies such that they were equipped with essential knowledge on how to protect and take good care of themselves while working with the HIV/AIDS infected persons.

Key activity 4: Providing welfare protection for the disadvantaged to ensure services they were entitled to according to the basic human rights - The overall target was 4,000 persons and the actual output was 4,045 persons or 101.13% of the set target. The details of this Key Activity are as follows:

4.1 Channels for the flow of news and information had been improved to offer the disadvantaged, persons facing social problems and those who were in the high risk group greater access to services available. The effort made included holding a public relation campaign to distribute documents with detailed information given concerning the rights and sources of assistance one may sought when facing problems.

4.2 A model of to protect the rights of persons who had undergone drug addiction treatment was developed to provide them with opportunity to access capacity-building service and prevent them from relapsing into drug addiction.

4.3 Occupational skill development targeting towards group formation of persons infected with and affected by HIV/AIDS and their families was carried out in 20 areas within Bangkok and areas under service coverage of 15 provincial social development centers.

4.4 Requests for assistance by persons facing social problems were received and processed to ensure that they were provided with opportunity and rights regarding social welfare.

2.3 Outcome against target:

The target group of disadvantaged people were provided with rehabilitation and assistance services which enabled them to lead their life within the limit of their financial capability and had access to basic social services above the set standard criteria.



Strategic guideline 3: Building and developing the capacity of the target population in making a living

The Department of Social Development and Welfare had proceeded with the implementation of 2 projects along this strategic guideline: a project on enhancing and developing the capacity of target population and a project on provision of knowledge and occupational development for the target population.

3.1 Major plan/project/activity: The project on enhancing and developing the capacity of target population

3.1.1 Output against target:

The output was that capacity of the target population had been enhanced and developed numbering 881,580 persons or 100.40% of the set target of 878,032 persons. The details are as follows:

Key Activity 1: Building and developing the capacity of highland communities - There were totally 514,887 beneficiaries or 100.06 % of the set target of 514,595 beneficiaries. The details are as follows:

1.1 Social development was promoted in 20 provinces, namely Kanchanaburi, Kamphaeng Phet, Chiang Rai, Chiang Mai, Tak, Nan, Prachuap Khiri Khan, Phayao, Phitsanulok, Phetchaburi, Phetchabun, Mae Hong Sorn, Phrae, Ratchaburi, Lampang, Lamphun, Loei, Uthai Thani, Suphan Buri and Sukhothai. Several activities were carried out under Key Activity 1. These included highland population data collecting and preparation of a social capital map, basic infrastructure development, support for learning activities in highland communities, highland capacity building and enhancing that proceeded in harmony with their way of life and promotion of social welfare service providing in highland communities covering a total of 500,292 beneficiaries.

1.2 The Buddhist Mission Project was promoted by supporting activities carried out by 300 monks living in 150 ashrams located in 14 northern and central provinces. The aims were to follow and make use of the teaching of the Lord Buddha as an instrument



to promote the moral development of the highland population. Support given included increasing the knowledge and skills and providing social welfare services for the Buddhist monks working in the project areas.

1.3 Support was given to the Royal Initiated Projects implemented in 7 northern provinces of Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Mae Hong Son, Lampoon, Payao, Kamphaeng Phet and Nan. Project activities included basic infrastructure development, training for highland population relating to farm and non-farm activities as well as social welfare services, promotion and support in the area of agriculture and welfare services for poor hill tribe families to increase the potential of the highlands and the opportunity for the population to be well-prepared for development, to be able to make a living on a sustainable and self-sufficiency basis and to promote the conservation of natural resources and environment within the highlands. There were totally 4,610 hill tribes who benefited from the projects.



1.4 The highland community economy was promoted in the northern and central areas. The highland population was provided with knowledge and standard services through various training courses that were designed and conducted in response to the specific needs of the population in each area. As a result, they were equipped with knowledge and skills in other alternative income-generating activities apart from their main economic activities. These supplementary income-generating activities, which proceeded in harmony with their tradition, culture and local wisdom, included, for example, cloth and rattan weaving, making of silverware products and group formation for ecotourism services. There were totally 2,515 hill tribes who were involved and benefited from the activities.

1.5 Capacity building to pursue highland income-generating activities had been promoted by organizing meetings with local authorities/organizations to select the target groups and conduct vocational training which was designed in response to local needs and labor market. There were totally 5,370 hill tribes who were involved and benefited.

1.6 As for the promotion of security in highland communities located along the borders of 3 provinces, namely Chiang Rai, Chiang Mai and Mae Hong Sorn, activities that had been carried out included the organizing of village meetings to increase better understanding about the government policy, the preparation of village development plans using the problem census technique, the formulation of youth groups to serve as field-level social development networks and to render assistance to those who encountered problems numbering 1,800 persons.

Key Activity 2: Building the capacity of population in the target area in making a living – Activities that had been implemented were involved with land management (i.e. recruitment of members of self-help land settlements, issuance of land documents or Nor Kor 3, handling of disputes and cadastral survey of reserved land), social development in self-help land settlements, occupational promotion, provision of credit facilities and management of natural resources. There were totally 159,167 beneficiaries or 100 % of the set target of 159,167 beneficiaries.

Key Activity 3: Maintaining cooperation with networks at field level in an integrated approach to social welfare service providing – There were totally 14,829 persons who benefited from the implementation of activities under the Key Activity 3 or 103.92 % of the set target of 14,270 persons. The details are as follows:

3.1 In areas where extension activities were followed up: Lessons learned from activities in the past and activities to be implemented in the future were reviewed in an attempt to work with the target population numbering 3,934 persons with the aims to promote activities relating to social welfare, to conduct follow-up and evaluation and to examine and conclude lessons learned.



3.2 In areas under a Tambon (District) Model: Activities carried out included the organizing of workshops and forums for public discussion, promoting activities relating to social welfare, making arrangements for study visits to areas covering those which were under the local administrative organizations where the Tambon Model had been put into actual practice and those which were outside the Model areas.

Key Activity 4: Promoting and supporting the work of the participatory social service centers – Activities included the organizing of forums where the potential of communities could be identified, thought-provoking forums, support for community meetings to select the centers' committee members and support for activities of the centers. There were 190,000 persons who were involved in activities under the Key Activity 4 or 100 % of the set target of 190,000 persons. The details are as follows:

4.1 New areas: Activities included organizing forums where the potential of communities could be identified and forums where knowledge and views could be shared and exchanged, maintaining coordination with networks and promoting and supporting activities relating to social welfare services within the framework of activities implemented by the social service centers. A total of 107,450 persons were involved in activities organized by social service centers in new areas.

4.2 Implementation areas in 1999: Personnel were prepared and activities relating to social welfare services were promoted and supported involving a total of 48,909 participants.

4.3 Areas where follow-up of extension activities in 2008 and 2009 took place: Lessons learned were reviewed for support which was given to capacity-building activities i.e. those relating to health, employment and income, education, tradition, culture and local wisdom. In addition, lessons learned were further examined and follow-up and evaluation were conducted in 12 zones of Bangkok covering 10,022 persons and in local areas covering 26,316 persons who were involved.

3.1.2 Outcome against target

The target groups within the target areas could make a living, develop financial security for their families and be provided with basic infrastructure services to build the capacity of themselves, their families, communities and the population in nearby communities. In addition to that, the process of people participation has been developed at field level.



3.2 Major plan/project/activity: The project on the provision of knowledge and occupational development for the target population

3.2.1 Output against target

The output was that the target population was provided with knowledge and occupational development. There were totally 67,533 beneficiaries or 113.85 % of the set target of 59,320 beneficiaries. The details are as follows:

Key Activity 1: Enhancing vocational skills of high-risk women and persons with disabilities in institutions – The total number of persons provided with the services was 6,091 or 136.42 % of the set target of 4,465. The details are as follows:

1.1 Vocational skill training and development was offered to persons with disabilities in 8 vocational training centers for persons with disabilities. Vocational training and development activities covered those in the fields of computer, leather work, tailoring/dressmaking, electrics etc. The aims of such provision were to enable persons with disabilities to make a living, earn income and become self-reliant. There were totally 1,107 persons with disabilities who benefitted from vocational skill training and development services.

1.2 Vocational skill training and development was provided for women in 8 welfare and vocational training centers for women. Focus of vocational training and development activities was on young girls and women who were poor, faced social problems, lacked opportunity to pursue higher education or unemployed. Several vocational training courses were organized including computer business, beauty salon service, hairdresser/barber shop service, tailoring/dressmaking, health and beauty services. There were 4,984 women who were provided with vocational training and vocational skill development. The aims were to increase the status of women and to offer women with employment and income opportunity to enable them to support themselves and their families.

Key Activity 2: Organizing vocational training and developing group formation skills - Vocational training was organized and the skills of group formation were developed for the target groups by encouraging and supporting the effort to set up income-generating groups and providing knowledge relating to occupational development with the aim to open up more employment and income opportunities. There were totally 41,510 persons who benefitted from the provision of services or 100 % of the set target of 41,510 persons. The details are as follows:

2.1 Vocational training under the Project on Building New Life for Rural Women – An 88-day vocational training course was organized nationwide for rural women and people in general who completed compulsory education but lacked opportunity to pursue higher education, those who were laid off or unemployed or poor to equip them with knowledge required in response to local market demand. The training that had been organized covered such subjects as blanket making, traditional cloth weaving, processing of textile products etc. While undergoing the training, each trainee received a daily allowance and would be further provided with family welfare assistance in the form of cash after the training. In addition, support was given to the 120-day actual practice after the training to develop group formation and management skills for income-generating activities of 15,000 women who had gone through the vocational training.

2.2 Promotion of short-term vocational skill development – During school holidays, a 5-day vocational training course was organized for 20,900 school-age children and youth to increase their vocational knowledge and skills. The aims were to provide them with employment opportunities and alternatives, to enable them to earn supplementary income for their families and to make use of their leisure time productively.

Key Activity 3: Promoting and implementing social development based on the philosophy of sufficiency economy - There were totally 19,932 persons who benefitted from activities that were implemented under this Key Activity or 149.36 % of the set target of 13,345 persons. The details are as follows:

3.1 Social development and promotion was provided in response to the Royal Initiative for a total of 4,360 persons. This was done by disseminating knowledge relating to income-generating activities along the line of sufficiency economy, promoting the model of a self-sufficient village, building the strengths of village households, promoting activities by the learning centers to spread knowledge on sufficiency economy, supporting self-sufficient households and promoting the campaign to use and develop vetiver grass.

3.2 The Coordinating Center for the Royal Initiative Projects carried out the promotion and development activities for a total of 5,949 persons along the line of sufficiency economy.

3.3 The philosophy of sufficiency economy was promoted in communities involving a total of 9,623 persons which can be classified as follows:

3.3.1 In 2010, the philosophy of sufficiency economy was promoted by organizing meetings to integrate the work of 5 partners involved, preparing the people for their participation, providing forums where key concepts and understanding could be further enhanced, building the capacity of community leaders and supporting activities contributing to or in line with the philosophy of sufficiency economy and forums to review and conclude lessons learned. There were totally 5,649 persons who were involved.

3.3.2 The philosophy of sufficiency economy was promoted in areas where the follow-up of the implementation of activities in 2007 – 2009 had been conducted by organizing meetings to integrate the work of 5 partners involved and by supporting activities that were in line with the philosophy of sufficiency economy. There were totally 1,774 persons who were involved.

3.3.3 Increasing chemical-free rice productivity was promoted in 14 highland areas of 14 provinces by launching a promotion process in communities, organizing training to provide knowledge on a complete cycle of chemical-free rice production, preparing a

summary report on increasing chemical-free rice productivity, promoting extension activities relating to increasing chemical-free rice productivity which involved a total of 420 persons and setting up learning centers within hill tribe welfare and development centers where 14 demonstration plant-beds had been constructed.

3.3.4 With regard to energy consumption, community self-reliance was promoted by organizing community forums to demonstrate how to produce biodiesel from jatropha, promoting jatropha extension activities and processing jatropha products into biodiesel. There were totally 1,780 persons who were involved.



3.2.2 Outcome against target

Vocational skills of the disadvantaged women, persons with disabilities and the target groups in communities were promoted and developed resulting in more income to support themselves and their families on the basis of sufficiency economy.

Strategic guideline 4: Strengthening the prevention and welfare protection for persons who are affected by social problems and prone to risks.

4.1 Major plan/project/activity: A project on prevention and welfare protection of the target population against human trafficking

4.1.1 Output against target:

The output was that the target population was provided with prevention and welfare protection against human trafficking. There were totally 111,770 persons who benefitted from the implementation of the following 2 key activities or 105.07 % of the set target of 106,380 persons. The details are as follows:

Key Activity 1: Preventing and dealing with the problem of human trafficking – Activities under Key Activity 1 were carried out and involved a total of 106,611 persons or 104.13 % of the set target of 102,380 persons. The detailed project implementation is as follows:

1.1 Coordination and dissemination of knowledge on how to prevent the problem of human trafficking for a total of 9,291 persons;

1.2 Provision of knowledge that would safeguard the target groups against human trafficking – This was done by organizing activities that would provide knowledge and disseminate information to the high-risk youth on how to prevent themselves from being lured into sex trade and to students, parents or guardians of children, community leaders and the general public on how to prevent themselves from being lured into the vicious cycle of human trafficking. The aims were to prevent the problem of prostitution especially in the high-risk youth group and to encourage people within society to be involved in preventing the problem. There were totally 89,065 persons participating in the training;

1.3 Assistance for 672 victims of human trafficking who were Thais, non-Thais and persons whose nationality could not be identified;

1.4 Capacity building for the target group numbering 6,344 persons to prevent them from being lured and becoming victims of human trafficking by organizing 300 classes of short-term 30-day vocational training courses to open up employment and income opportunities so that they could support themselves financially and be able to live with their families;



1.5 Provision of services relating to assistance, medical treatment, rehabilitation and occupational development for a total of 447 victims of human trafficking which were made available in 4 welfare protection and occupational development centers for men located in the 4 provinces of Prathum Thani, Ranong, Songkhla and Chiang Rai;

1.6 Contact made with countries concerned for 21 times to maintain inter-country cooperation for the prevention, assistance and welfare protection of victims of human trafficking;

1.7 Medical treatment, physical and psychological rehabilitation for 792 victims of human trafficking.

Key Activity 2: Rehabilitating and building the capacity of the destitute or homeless and the

high-risk groups to protect themselves from being lured into human trafficking –

There were totally 2,598 beneficiaries or 103.92 % of the set target of 2,500 beneficiaries. The details are as follows:

2.1 A project on rehabilitation and capacity building of 2,000 destitute persons was implemented in 40 provinces to prevent them from being lured into human trafficking. Project implementation involved the organizing of vocational training and training that would provide them with more knowledge and better understanding with regards to the rights and opportunities to make a living. The aims were to enhance their capacity and to provide employment opportunity for the destitute or homeless and the high-risk groups with a tendency to become the destitute or homeless;

2.2 Activities involving with the provision of assistance and rehabilitation services for a total of 608 persons were carried out by Baan Mitmaitri at 5 sites located in Bangkok, Chiang Mai, Nakhon Ratchasima, Nakhon Sri Thammarat and Phuket;

Key Activity 3: Providing knowledge targeting towards anti-human trafficking - There were totally 2,561 persons who were involved or 170.73 % of the set target of 1,500 persons. Under this Key Activity, training courses/workshops were organized to provide knowledge that would further prevent the problem of human trafficking and to proceed with a more preventive measure against the problem.

4.1.2 Outcome against target

The high-risk groups and victims of human trafficking were provided with medical treatment and rehabilitation services made available through various project activities. They gained knowledge on how to prevent the problem and be able to pass on the knowledge gained to their families and communities such that they became more aware of the problem of human trafficking.

4.2 Major plan/project/activity: A project on welfare protection and capacity building of the target population to develop strong families

4.2.1 Output against target:

The output was that welfare protection and capacity building services was provided for the target population which further contributed to the strengthening of family institution. There were totally 17,630 beneficiaries or 218.90 % of the set target of 8,054 beneficiaries. The details are as follows:

Key Activity 1: Implementing prevention and welfare protection measures for victims of domestic violence – Activities carried out under Key Activity 1 included the organizing of training/workshops for concerned officials to dissemination knowledge that would prevent domestic violence, knowledge about the Domestic Violence Victim Protection Act B.E. 2550 (2007) and other laws which were relevant. The aim was to provide essential knowledge so that the officials concerned were well-informed about the processes that were involved. There were totally 11,326 participants or 398.80 % of the set target of 2,840 participants.



Key Activity 2: Providing welfare protection and assistance through an operations center for prevention of domestic violence – The center was responsible for services at the central level of Bangkok and at regional level which benefitted a total of 6,304 persons or 120.91% of the set target of 5,214 persons.

4.2.2 Outcome against target

The victims of domestic violence were provided with medical treatment, rehabilitation and welfare protection services to the extent that they could eventually reintegrate into families and communities.

Strategic Issue 3: Promoting social welfare service providing and social security for older persons

A strategic guideline was adopted by the Department of Social Development and Welfare to promote Strategic Issue 3 which involved enhancing the potential of older persons and improving social welfare service providing for older persons by implementing a project that linked with the Strategic Issue entitled “Social welfare service providing for older persons”.

Strategic guideline: Enhancing the potential of older persons and improving social welfare service providing for older persons

Major plan/project/activity: A project on social welfare service providing for older persons.

Output against target

The output was the target population who was provided with social welfare services. There were totally 96,521 beneficiaries or 108.84 % of the set target of 88,680 beneficiaries. The details are as follows:

Key Activity 1: Organizing activities in social welfare development centers for older persons – There were totally 55,632 persons who benefitted from the services or activities organized for them or 107.75 % of the set target of 51,630 persons. The details are as follows:

1.1 Provision of services in 12 social welfare development centers for older persons – Within each center, services were made available through various sub-centers i. e. a social welfare-related IT center, a training and development center, a learning center, an institutional-based social welfare service providing center for older persons, a counseling and referral center covering a total of 1,502 persons.

1.2 Organizing of activities relating to service providing for older persons - The aim was to enhance and develop their capacity so that they could live and be happy with their families and communities. The activities benefitted a total of 54,130 older persons

Key Activity 2: Organizing community-based preparation activities for older persons - There were totally 40,889 persons who were involved or 110.36 % of the set target of 37,050 persons. The details are as follows:

2.1 The organizing of community-based preparation activities for older persons prior to entering the threshold of ageing – The aim was to enable older persons in communities to be well-prepared before the age of 60 by providing them with more knowledge and better understanding about unavoidable changes in a life cycle that a person has to go through physically, mentally, emotionally and socially. Such knowledge should help older persons to adjust their attitude and relationship with others and be able to maintain the status of being older persons suitable for themselves and suitable with changing situation of the present society. There were totally 10,563 persons who were involved.

2.2 The organizing of activities to strengthen the relationship among family members – A total of 13,204 older persons and family members had participated in recreation activities that further strengthened their relationship. Each family had a chance to gain knowledge that would increase better understanding among members resulting in the ability of people who might be from different generations to adjust and live together in one happy family. There were totally 11,512 persons who were involved.

2.3 Promotion of community participation in building or improving the conditions of older persons' houses – These included household improvements and repairs, to enable older persons to live in safe and suitable environment. In 2010, houses of older persons were repaired and places for organizing activities for older persons were improved. There were a total of 9,009 persons who were involved.

2.4 Provision of services by 23 community-based service centers

2.5 Promotion of community saving targeting towards welfare for older persons in communities - The aim was to provide older persons with knowledge about financial management and benefits gained from maintaining the value of reducing the expenses and increasing income to be further accumulated for their own welfare in the future. There were totally 4,688 persons who participated in the activity.

2.6 Support given to enhance the ability of older persons to make use of their wisdom for employment and income generation - The aim was to provide opportunity for older persons to spend their time productively in the transfer of their knowledge, experience and wisdom to communities. There were totally 4,576 persons who participated in the activity.

2.7 A total of 645 older persons were encouraged to be involved and serve as volunteers for community welfare services.

Outcome against target

The capacity of older persons was built socially and economically. They had a chance to use their knowledge, experience and wisdom to generate income for themselves, their families and communities.



Strategic Issue 4: Developing the system of social development and welfare networking

The strategic guideline was adopted by the Department of Social Development and Welfare to promote Strategic Issue 4 which involved promoting and supporting participation by local communities and local areas in social development and social welfare service providing. This was done by implementing a project which linked with the Strategic Issue entitled “Enhancing and developing the capacity of networks”.

Strategic guideline: Promoting and supporting participation by local areas and communities in social development and social welfare service providing

Major plan/project/activity: A project on enhancing and developing the capacity of networks

Output against target

The output was the result of project implementing on enhancing and developing the capacity of networks. There were totally 1,140 networks that were involved in activities or 100 % of the set target of 1,140 networks. The details are as follows:

Key Activity 1: Strengthening networks at tambon (sub-district) level

– There were totally 540 networks that were involved or 100 % of the set target of 540 networks. People in the target areas, social development organizations, volunteers, local administration organizations and concerned agencies were encouraged and given support to form themselves into a group of social development and welfare organizations with a systematic linkage being maintained with local administrative organizations. The process included selecting target area/tambon, planning, coordinating for the implementation of plans that had been formulated, organizing community forums with focus being on tambon social development and welfare and workshops for plan/project preparation by networks and conducting regular follow-up. The promotion of these activities had resulted in the ability of the population in each target area to gain greater access to more thoroughly provided social development and welfare services to the extent that the social development and human security networks at tambon level were eventually established according to the set target.

Key Activity 2: Enhancing the working mechanism among networks

– Activities implemented under this Key Activity included developing a strong and continuous working mechanism at amphoe (district) level for smooth coordination, maintaining linkages,

promoting the integration of services and exchange of experiences among social development and human security networks at tambon (sub-district) level. The working mechanism at district level was strengthened and involved a process comprising selection of target area, planning coordination for the organizing of a community forum with focus being on tambon social development and welfare, a workshop to integrate plans developed by networks and conclusion of lessons learned about the amphoe or district mechanism. The activities were carried out in 60 districts or 100% of the set target of 60 districts.

Key Activity 3: Monitoring and developing the capacity of networks – The capacity of networks was developed in 540 tambons or 100% of the set target of 540 tambons. The activity involved monitoring and strengthening the roles of social development and human security networks at tambon or sub-district level such that they could form the relationship both horizontally and vertically, promoting linkages both internally and externally and developing the capacity of networks to proceed continuously with the implementation of activities relating to social development and welfare which were accepted by local communities/ areas. The details are as follows:

3.1 Developing the capacity of networks – An action plan to enhance the capacity of networks was prepared and subsequently implemented. Support was further given for work as performed by networks and for supervision to monitor their work.

3.2 Conducting an assessment of the potential level of networks – An instrument was used to assess the potential level of networks involving a questionnaire concerning the work of social development and human security networks at tambon (sub-district) level. Each network would conduct self-assessment based on questions in the questionnaire. The answers were then processed and classified into 5 groups: The group of networks with exceptionally high potential, the group of networks with high potential, the group of networks with moderate potential, the group of networks with little potential and the group of networks with low potential.

Outcome against target

The networks at Tambon-level had more capacity to perform the supporting role of social development and welfare service providing in areas of the target groups more effectively.

Activities implemented in Fiscal Year 2010 according to the Public Information Act B.E.2540 (1997)

In the fiscal Year 2010, the Department of Social Development and Welfare implemented activities according to the Public Information Act B.E.2540 (1997) as follows:

1. A Public Information Committee of the Department of Social Development and Welfare was set up to be responsible for the supervision and implementation of activities by the Public Information Center, Department of Social Development and Welfare to proceed according to the Public Information Act B.E.2540 (1997).

2. The Public Information Center which was set up by the Department is located on the 2nd Floor of Building 3, Department of Social Development and Welfare. There is a guideboard which clearly shows the location of the Center. It is a place where information services are available to the general public i.e. provision of news and information, advice given to those who seek information services. A list or index of news and information has been improved to become more systematic so as to facilitate and develop a more convenient search for information.

3. The following public information-related activities were carried out by the Department of Social Development and Welfare:

3.1 Send information as specified in Article 7(1)(2)(3) to be published in the Royal Thai Government Gazette, Ordinary Version, Volume 121, Part 117 Ngor dated December 30, 2004;

3.2 Prepare data/information as specified in Article 7(1)(2)(3) and (4) which was kept in files classified by each type of information for the general public who visited the Public Information Center;

3.3 Provide information according to Article 9 which the general public could easily access (The information was kept in files classified by each group of information based on each pair of brackets under Article 9. Some information was disseminated through the website of the Department [www.dsdw.go.th]. There was a total of 455 persons who required for the information service);

3.4 Take action according to the Article 23(3) concerning personal information by making arrangements for the information to be published in the Royal Thai Government Gazette, ordinary version, Volume 121, Special Part 134 Ngor dated December 8, 2004.

4. Knowledge concerning the rights to access public information was disseminated as follows:

4.1 Information was disseminated through various media i.e. the journal of the Department of Social Development and Welfare, the direct contact with people in actual field visit to provide them with the Department's news and information, the organizing of exhibitions and the public relation campaign through community broadcasting.

4.2 Feedback was obtained from the general public regarding revealing public information through various channels i.e. starting a web-board to hear comments or suggestions from the general public, placing a suggestion box and making use of information obtained for management purpose with regard to whether or not public information should be revealed or information services should be provided for the general public.

5. A systematic management system has been developed with regard to revealing public information. Responsible officials were assigned in particular to ensure that the law relating to public information would be enforced in addition to particular attention and control that the Department's executives had unfailingly maintained to promote strict law enforcement i.e. organizing meetings to review the guidelines of how to implement activities as stated in the Public Information Act, ensuring that the knowledge concerning the Public Information Act B.E.2540 (1997) would be provided during seminars or training courses to ensure that the Department's personnel would be equipped with more knowledge, better understanding and capable of taking appropriate action.

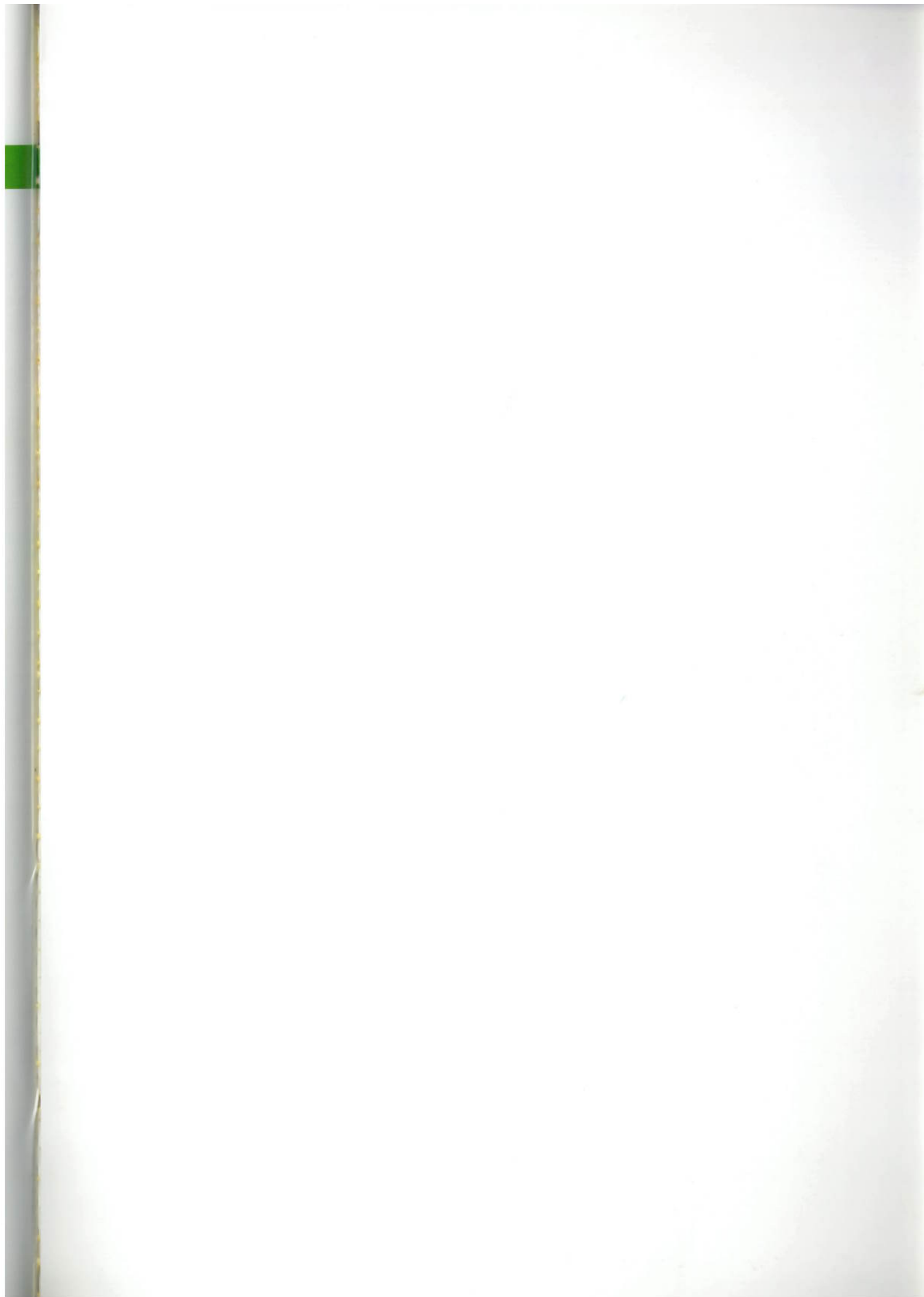
